GENERAL INFORMATION

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STUDENT WELLNESS POLICY:

Holy Name of Jesus School in collaboration with the Diocese of Harrisburg recognizes that student wellness and proper nutrition are related to students' physical well-being, growth, development, and readiness to learn. Holy Name of Jesus School is committed to providing a school environment that promotes student wellness, proper nutrition, nutrition education, and regular physical activity as part of the total learning experience. In a healthy school environment, students will learn about the participation of wellness in positive dietary and lifestyle practices that can improve student achievement.

SCHOOL LUNCHES:

School lunches are \$2.00 per day. For those who pack their lunches, milk may be purchased for \$.50 per day. Students are expected to pay daily, however, they may charge their lunch/milk if they do forget their money. Holy Name participates in the federal lunch program. Forms are available in the office.

It is expected that all lunch/milk debts will be paid on the next school day.

Students can either buy school lunch or bring lunch from home. **Parents are not permitted to bring fast food (such as McDonalds, Burger King, etc.) in for lunch.**

All drinks must be in non-breakable containers. Sodas are not allowed.

Pre-payment

It is possible to pre-pay lunch for your child(ren). The school supplies a lunch menu every month. If you know what lunches your child(ren) want to purchase or you want them to buy on certain days you may pre-pay the cafeteria for these days. Please send an envelope, ***clearly marked CAFETERIA, to school with your child(ren). List the name and homeroom of each child along with the date/s each child is purchasing lunch.*** You may pay using cash or by writing a check. If you write a check, please make it payable to Holy Name of Jesus School. The cafeteria manager will keep a lunch record for each child.

STUDENT COUNCIL:

The Student Council is composed of any interested 8th grade student. There are approximately 4-5 Faculty Moderators. Two of the moderators will be 7th or 8th grade teachers.

The purpose of the Student Council is to allow all 8th grade students to develop and use their talents by working as a team in leadership and service to the school and church community. The Student Council may assist the principal, teachers and students in a variety of ways. The students plan and carry out spiritual and social activities within the school. They help to promote the theme for the school year through planning and implementing celebrations and activities for the whole school.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:

Many extra-curricular activities are available to students according to their grade level. Some of these activities are:

STUDENT GROUP ACCIDENT INSURANCE:

Parents may purchase two plans of insurance:

1. General Accident
2. Dental Accident

Information on rate and coverage will be given early in the school year.

VACATIONS/EDUCATIONAL TRIPS

It is preferred that family vacations or trips not be taken during the school year. This is difficult for the student due to missing class instruction skills and homework.

If the trip is necessary, please complete the Vacation/Educational Trip Form. Complete

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one form per child, list the exact days of absence and the reason the child(ren) will be out of school. Please sign, date, and return this form to the homeroom teacher at least one-week before leaving. This request must be approved by the principal.

Students will receive missed assignments upon their return to school. Students are required to complete assignments in a time period not to exceed the number of days missed due to the vacation/educational trip.

In the beginning of the school year, we supply every family with a Vacation/Trip Form. Please keep this form with your school information. If you have misplaced this form, one may be printed from our website www.holynameofjesus.com using the **FORMS** link or by picking one up at school in the school lobby. This form may be faxed (657-9135) to the school office according to the above instructions.

STUDENT PLACEMENT:

Student placement for the following school year is based on:

- Instructional needs
- Balance of genders
- Classes of mixed abilities

If your child has specific instructional needs that you would like to have considered for the child's class placement the following year, this must be placed in writing to the administration by May 15th for the following school year.

WITHDRAWALS FROM SCHOOL:

Parents/guardians should notify the school office as promptly as possible about the withdrawal of a student. Given all financial obligations are met the school office will forward the appropriate academic records to the new school upon confirmation of the receiving school office's notification of the student's registration.

FAMILY INFORMATION SHEET:

It is essential for the safety and welfare of the child that the parent/guardian fill in and return the Family Information Sheet. This form is sent home on the first day of school or upon admission to school.

It is vitally important that the parent/guardian gives the school office a usable telephone number and keeps the school informed of any changes of address or telephone numbers.

All telephone numbers, including unlisted numbers, are kept confidential.

SAFETY AND SECURITY:

To provide security for all Holy Name of Jesus School faculty, staff, and students:

- The school doors are locked throughout the school day.

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- Security cameras have been installed for the main buildings.
- Visitors must ring the buzzer and wait to be admitted by the office staff.
- Walkie-Talkies are utilized by most staff members throughout the school campus.
- Many faculty and staff members are trained in Heart Saver First Aid.
- Safety cones and barriers are placed in various areas around the school to prohibit traffic flow and maintain safe speeds through/around play areas.

For the past seven years Holy Name of Jesus School has had a faculty Safety Committee. They continually work toward improving student and school safety by developing extensive emergency procedures for a variety of crisis scenarios.

EMERGENCY DISMISSAL FORMS AND CONTACT INFORMATION:

On the first day of school parents will receive via an opening day packet an Emergency Dismissal Form to be completed and returned to the office. This form includes required information from you regarding the mode of transportation for a scheduled early dismissal, emergency dismissal, or everyday dismissal.

Should essential changes need to be made to your child's mode of transportation on the day of an early dismissal that are different than what you have instructed on these forms, please call the school office as soon as possible so that we can inform your child.

FIELD TRIPS:

Holy Name of Jesus School encourages educational field trips for each grade level. These trips may or may not require a small fee for each participating student. Field trips are monitored by the administration to align with the curriculum and be age appropriate.

Parent permission is required to participate in a field trip. The field trip permission form will be given to the students to take home to be signed by the parent/guardian. The form must be signed and returned before the child may participate in the field trip.

TELEPHONE:

The school telephone is for official school business only and the lines need to be open for such calls. Therefore, students may only use the phones for very serious reasons, in case of emergency, and only with proper permission from the office.

We will not interrupt the classrooms to get a student in order to receive phone calls from parents, unless it is an emergency. The office will pass on all messages to the students.

We understand for safety reasons parents permit their children to carry cell phones. During the school day 7:00am - 3:30pm cell phones must be turned off and stored within the student's backpack. The student may not carry or use their cell phone for any reason during the school day.

Holy Name of Jesus School is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged cell phones.

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The Cell Phone Agreement found in the Parent/Student Handbook needs to be completed and returned to the school office within the first week of school.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Electronic Devices including but not limited to an iPod, Sandisk, MP3 players, CD players may be used before the hours of 7AM and after 3:30 PM on school days. Should these personal electronic devices be brought to school for any reason, they need to be kept in the student's backpack unless used for instructional purposes.

Holy Name of Jesus School is not responsible for lost, damaged, or stolen electronic devices.

Please note: These electronic devices may not be used during inside or outside recess.

SCHOOL PICTURES:

Professional photographers will take individual pictures of the students during the first half of the school year. At that time, students receive flyers to notify the parents/guardians of "picture day" and picture packages. No parent/guardian is under any obligation to purchase the school pictures.

Students may dress up for individual school pictures.

In the spring, the picture company will take Class pictures. Again, parents/guardians are under no obligation to purchase class pictures. For class pictures, students are expected to wear the school uniform.

BIRTHDAYS:

On the day of a student's birthday their name is announced to the school community and they are invited to pick up a birthday pencil outside the school office. Half-birthdays are celebrated during the months of January, February, and March.

We recognize that parents want to celebrate this special day with their child. A suggested way to share this occasion with others would be to provide healthy birthday treats for the homeroom or to make a donation for a book to be placed in the school library.

Please check with the homeroom teacher if any students in the class have food allergies.

However, we cannot permit a personal delivery of flowers or balloons to celebrate the day.

PARTY INVITATIONS:

Parents and students are encouraged to distribute party invitations outside of the school day so as not to ostracize students who are not invited.

LOST AND FOUND:

We have three areas where students may find items that they have lost:

- **A table in the lobby area of the primary building** - where clothing, lunch boxes, books, papers, etc. might be found
- **In the gym** - for any items found after a physical education class
- **In the school office**, where jewelry, glasses, money might be found

Students who have lost items are encouraged to check these locations.

Please label all personal items with name, address and telephone number.

BOOKS AND SCHOOL PROPERTY:

Each student is responsible for the proper care of the textbook assigned to him/her for the school year. All textbooks are to have covers on them at all times. If a book is lost, damaged, or destroyed, the student/parent may be responsible for reimbursing the school for the cost of the book.
