Provide events or evidence from the story to prove that this is what you think the theme is. For example, the theme of The Giver is that memories are important to human beings.
- 3. From one or two pages of your book, list 5 of each of the following parts of speech.
 - 5 nouns
 - 5 verbs
 - 5 adjectives
 - 5 adverbs
 - 5 pronouns
- 4. Write one paragraph describing the main character. What does he/she look like? How does he/she react? What are the conflicts he/she is dealing with? Does he/she change in the story? How does he/she solve the conflicts?
- 5. Describe the setting and the time the story takes place. Is the setting important to the story? Why?

To prepare for National History Day

Students are required to begin basic research related to the theme, 'Communication in History: The Key to Understanding.' Students are not locked in to the topic they researched for their National History Day projects – this assignment is intended to generate in-class Social Studies discussions.

Communications in History:

Exchange of information, methods, modes, how words, thoughts and ideas have influenced society (ex: Declaration of Independence, letters, speeches, political cartoons, news media, etc.) protests, inventions and innovation.

Students must write a good paragraph (5-8 sentences) on the following points:

- 1. Who or What was involved?
- 2. What form of communication was used?
- 3. What was the short-term and long-term outcome?
- 4. What were the positive and negative outcome?
- 5. How was history changed?

- 2. Watch The History Channel.
- 3. While on vacation, look for historic sites where communication had an impact on history.




