



### **Red Ribbon Week**

**Red Ribbon Week, October 26 – 30, 2020** is a national event which brings attention to being drug free. At Holy Name of Jesus School we celebrate this week in conjunction with our Diocesan Chastity Curriculum. God created each of us in His image, and we are all temples of the Holy Spirit. We want to emphasize to our students that we must thank God for the beautiful gift of our bodies, and we must keep them safe and healthy.

The daily **Red Ribbon Week** themes and activities are:

#### **Monday, October 26, 2020 - “Vote for your Future to be Drug Free!”**

Opening discussions in each classroom about protecting our bodies as temples of the Holy Spirit.

Students will vote by signing a pledge to remain drug free for a healthy future. Students will receive a sticker that says, “I voted to be drug free”. Students will also be able to vote on a jar that they believe holds the most objects! A prize will be awarded to the winner!

#### **Tuesday, October 27, 2020 – Being Drug Free Is No Sweat!**

Students may wear their hoodies with their school uniforms.

This is our exercise day! The teachers will decide what activity the Kindergarten to third grade students will do. This is **only a 20 - minute** exercise period. Students may use available parking lot space to play their games.

Grades 4 to 8 will participate in a grade level kickball tournament. Winners will be announced. This is **only a 20 - minute** game. The kickball game will be played in the area outside the primary classrooms.

#### **Wednesday, October 28, 2020 – Wacky Wednesday! (Using Drugs Is Wacky)**

Students may wear wacky socks, and/or their uniform shirt may be worn inside out. Students may also wear a wacky hair style. **No hair may be colored, sprayed with color, or dyed.**

#### **Thursday, October 29, 2020 – Say Boo to Drugs!**

Students may wear a Halloween shirt or sweatshirt, orange or black shirts, witch hat, or Halloween headbands. Jeans, gym pants, cargo pants, or uniform pants may be worn with sneakers. Jeans may not have holes or have threadbare areas. The designs on the clothing can not be gory, scary or gothic.

#### **Friday, October 30, 2020 – “Put Your Faith to the Test and Imitate the Best!”**

Today is the All Saints’ Parade! Students will bring their saint costume to school with them in the morning. The Saint costume will be worn over their school uniform.

After the parade, the students will return to their homeroom to enjoy a pre-packaged snack and an individual size drink.
