Meetings:

March – Geocaching – The scouts will cover the hobby of Geocaching. This is a merit badge driven activity. The program covers use of compass and map and GPS to determine locations and distances. It also involves items to place in the Cache. The cache is like a time capsule that gets routinely opened. The group that finds the geocache places and entry in the log and takes and item but also leaves a new item in the cache. There is a capstone cache exercise for June15th when we have more light to establish the Geocache.

April – Senior Patrol Leader Elections. This is an opportunity for the scouts to run for Senior Patrol leader and Patrol leader.

Senior Patrol Leader must be a First-Class Scout or Above. The SPL works for the Scoutmaster to run all meetings, schedule activities, and lead the Troop on Campouts. If the scouts are interested in being the Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, they must run for Senior Patrol Leader.

Patrol Leaders are also elected. They perform the same functions for each patrol.

The Scouts sign up for troop positions. Prior to the assignment they must inform the Troop what they did and recommendations for the next person holding the position

May -

May 4th is the swimming event. It is at the Jewish Community Center-3301 N. Front Street Harrisburg 17110. The scouts perform the swim test which is required for summer camp. New Scouts also perform their lifesaving skills requirements. There is also time for fun in the pool.

Linglestown Memorial Day Parade – The Troop has made it a custom to participate in the Linglestown parade. As details become available this information will be announced at the Scout Meeting.

June – Fishing activity The Troop will do a Fishing Evening Outing on June 22nd. The Troop is also open to invite the Pack (s). We would meet at Leader Pond in Hummelstown. (To be Coordinated)

New Scout Skills. For meetings, we will have a Scout leader (Assistant Senior Patrol leader or Instructor or Troop Guide) who will work with the new scouts to learn and master skills required for the Ranks of Scout through First Class. There are several skills involved including camping, hiking, water activities, and related activities including tying knots.

Recruiting new Scouts. We have experienced a lean few years on new scouts joining the Troop. We are open to bringing in any Den of Webelos for a meeting or campout to show them what we have to offer. If parents know of any other group we could invite to pique interest in scouting please inform Mr. Crouse, Dr. Davis, or Mr. Irving.

Patrol Leaders Council – Mr. Irving would like to hold the Patrol Leaders Council in conjunction with troop committee meetings on a Monday Night away from a Meeting night. The Patrol Leaders Council is the Senior Patrol Leader, The Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, The Patrol Leaders, and any other member who can contribute a role – Guide, Instructor as needed. They plan upcoming meetings and campouts. This is so the Scouts plan their own meetings and the activities the Troop performs.

Fund Raising

<u>Camp Cards</u> – The Camp Card Sale is designed to help Scouts earn their own way to summer camp. The Camp Card is a discount Card that offers deals at area businesses to the purchaser. Participating units and their scouts will earn at least 50% commission for each card they sell. A customer can purchase a Camp Card, but they will get far more than the purchase price. If a customer regularly visits any of the stores on the card and uses all the discounts, they will be receiving all of their money back – Plus they will help someone go to summer camp. Units can return the unsold cards.

March 9th Troop Meeting - Camp Cards distributed to Scouts (I would like to discuss sale before handing out Camp Cards)

May 18th Troop Meeting - Camp Card money and unsold/undamaged cards due

Camp Cards will be distributed at our March 9th troop meeting. Scouts earn 50% commission (\$2.50) for each card sold. This fundraiser is a great way for Scouts to earn funds to help pay for summer camp or high adventure base camp. It is not only a low risk fundraiser because unsold/undamaged cards can be returned but also a high return fundraiser because of the volume sale potential and practical discount, value-added offerings that the customer gets from purchasing a Camp Card. Our Scouts have traditionally performed very well in this fundraiser while also building funds in their scout account.

The *local offers* of the Camp Card include 3 one-time tab coupons that are separated from the main card and between 6-8 multiple use offers that are valid through December 31, 2020. Each Camp Card also has an *online code* that the card purchaser can use to access hundreds of additional local offers. The purchaser visits www.boyscoutscampcard.com and enters their code number to set up their account to start saving more money. The online account is also valid until December 31, 2020. Users can also *download an app* to their smartphone and redeem offers immediately from their phones.

2020 Council-Sponsored Prizes: For every 50 Camp Cards sold, a Scout will receive a \$25 gift card. Gift cards may be selected for the Mechanicsburg Scout Shop, Trading Post at Hidden Valley Scout Reservation, or Trading Post at Camp Tuckahoe. Sell 150 Camp Cards and pick all three! Gift cards will be <u>mailed</u> to Scouts prior to June and must be used by December 31, 2020.

- 1. Top Selling Scout The first place, top selling Scout in our Keystone Capital District will receive a free week of camp at a 2020 or 2021 New Birth of Freedom summer camp.
