PENTECOST SUNDAY

We already heard today's Gospel proclaimed on the Second Sunday of Easter this year (Lectionary Cycle A). That Gospel passage, however, also included the description of Jesus' appearance to Thomas. In that context, we were led reflect on belief and unbelief.

In the context of the Feast of Pentecost, John 20:19-23 reminds us about the integral connection between the gifts of peace and forgiveness and the action of the Holy Spirit. Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace. Jesus then commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." He breathes the Holy Spirit upon the disciples and sends them to continue his work of reconciliation through the forgiveness of sins. Jesus' act of breathing the Holy Spirit mirrors God's act of breathing life into Adam at the time of Creation. In fact, both the Greek and Hebrew words for "spirit" can also be translated as "breath."

This Gospel reminds us that the Church is called to be a reconciling presence in the world. The reconciling presence of Christ is celebrated in the Church's sacramental life. In the Sacrament of Baptism, we are cleansed of sin and become a new creation in Christ. In the Sacrament of Penance, the Church celebrates the mercy of God through the forgiving of sins. This reconciling presence is also to be a way of life for Christians. In situations of conflict, we are to be agents of peace and harmony among people.

SACRAMENTS

Baptisms are held every Sunday after the 12:00 noon Mass. Parents are expected to attend an information and instruction session before the Baptism of the child. This session is held the second Wednesday of every month at 7:00 p.m. in the school library. Baptismal Registration forms can be found in the Parish Office or on our website. Godparents must be practicing Catholics, age 16 or older, have already received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, and, if married, married in accord with Catholic Church Law.

Matrimony: Diocesan Common Policy requires nine to twelve months advance notification of the priest or deacon and attendance at marriage preparation. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) - Mondays at 7:00 p.m., September through Easter. Please contact the Parish Office for information.

Visitation of the Sick: Please notify the Parish Office when a member of the Parish is in the hospital or if someone is unable to attend Mass and wishes to receive Communion.

Persons with Celiac Disease: Persons with this challenge are usually unable to receive the normal wheat host used for Mass. We provide a separate chalice for the reception of Holy Communion at each Mass. As the Eucharistic Ministers are receiving Holy Communion at the altar, please come forward to the front of the Church and someone will bring the chalice for you to receive the Precious Blood.

We welcome all new members to our parish family. Please register at the Parish Office in order that we might be of assistance to you. If you move or change your phone number, please notify the Parish Office so that our records can be kept current.



BISHOP'S LETTER FOR PENTECOST SUNDAY

May 2020

Dear Friends in Christ,

The Acts of the Apostles describes how our Blessed Mother and the Apostles gathered in the upper room behind locked doors waiting in prayer for the coming of the Holy Spirit. We can relate to their "sheltering in place" as we eagerly look forward to gathering once again with family and friends, with co-workers and with fellow parishioners.

This recent academic semester has been for our seminarians a similar time of turbulence seasoned with joy. Almost all have been sent home from their seminaries while still taking part in their classes, lectures, and formation sessions remotely. They have been assisting their pastors with live streamed liturgies and services. Through all this our seminarians have remained firm in their commitment to priestly formation, their prayer for others, and in their zeal to be of service to God's holy people.

When I have visited our seminarians this past year at their various seminaries, they have always been most grateful for the tremendous support they receive personally from many organizations and individuals. Our twenty-four men in active studies are dedicated to being part of the movement of the Holy Spirit to bring new life and energy into our Church and so into our world. Our seminarians pray for the people of the diocese every day, and I ask you to pray for them and for more young men to step forward with a positive response to the Lord's call to the priesthood.

The Annual Pentecost Collection is one of the most important resources we have to provide the funds necessary to educate and assist so many men in their journey to the altar. The cost to educate our seminarians is almost \$1 million every year: the education and formation of your future priests – men with zeal for souls – is one of our greatest responsibilities as the people of God.

Our Annual Pentecost Collection will be taken up this May 30/31. I know that many of us are struggling due to the Covid-19 crisis, but I ask you to give whatever support you can to this collection which supports the formation of our future priests.

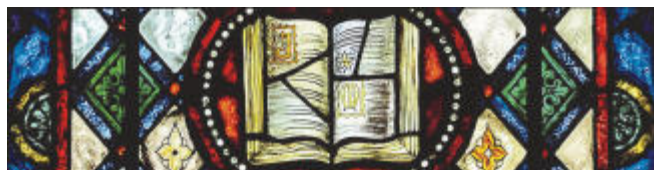

**Spiritual Communion**

As you have heard, Bishop Gainer has temporarily suspended all daily and weekend Masses in the Diocese of Harrisburg, as well as all public liturgies and devotions.

However, you can still make a daily spiritual communion! St. Thomas Aquinas described spiritual communion as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the most Holy Eucharist and lovingly embrace him." This includes circumstances where we cannot physically receive Him in sacramental communion.

No particular prayer is required to make a spiritual communion, however here is a popular prayer attributed to St. Alphonsus Liguori:

"My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Blessed Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire you with all my heart. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, I ask you to come spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already in my heart and unite myself to you completely. Please do not let me ever be separated from you."

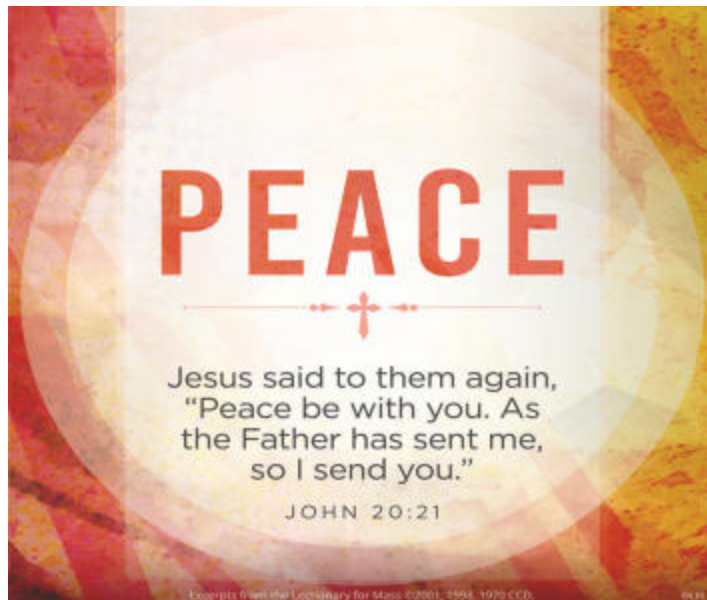
