FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

On the first Sunday of Lent, the Gospel reading in each Lectionary cycle is about Jesus' temptation in the desert. This event in the life of Jesus is reported in each of the Synoptic Gospels—Matthew, Mark, and Luke—but it is not found in John's Gospel. This year we read Mark's account of this event.

Mark tells us only that Jesus was led into the desert by the Spirit and that for 40 days he was tempted by Satan. The Gospels of Matthew and Luke explain that Jesus fasted while in the desert, that Satan presented him with three temptations, and that Jesus refused each one, quoting Scripture.

In Mark's Gospel, we are told that Jesus went into the desert immediately after his baptism, led by the Spirit. Jesus' public ministry in Galilee begins after his temptation in the desert. Mark's Gospel makes a connection between the arrest of John the Baptist and the beginning of Jesus' ministry.

The fact that Jesus spent 40 days in the desert is significant. This recalls the 40 years that the Israelites wandered in the desert, that the prophet Elijah also journeyed in the desert for 40 days and nights, and the 40 days for the season of lent.

In Mark's Gospel, the desert marks beginning of Jesus' battle with Satan. During Lent, we are led by the Holy Spirit to remember the vows of Baptism in which we promised to reject sin and to follow Jesus. Just as Jesus was ministered to by the angels, God also supports us in our struggle against sin and temptation. We succeed because Jesus conquered sin once and for all in his saving death on the cross.

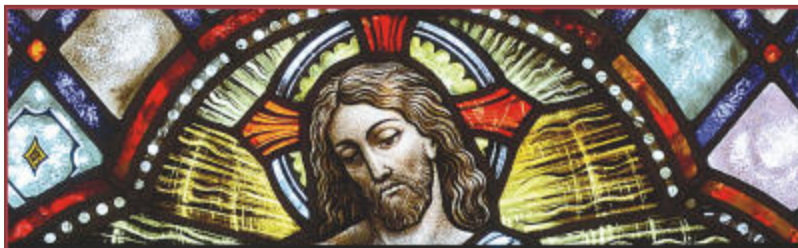
Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) - Mondays at 7:00 p.m., September through Easter. Please contact the Parish Office for information.

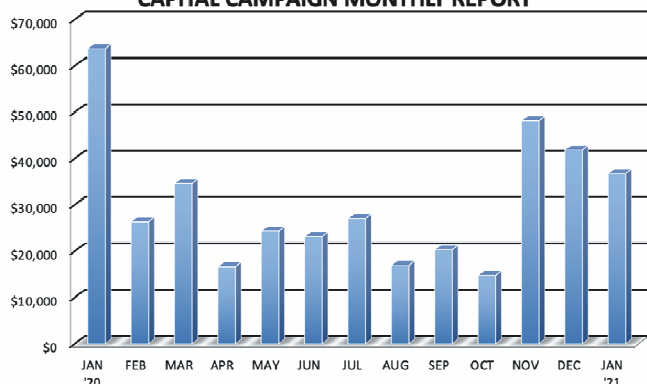

The Capital Campaign is off to a good start. We have received over **\$564,000** from our generous parishioners! Our goal for the Campaign is to raise 2 million dollars. Please join fellow parishioners in supporting the campus improvements. You may use

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN MONTHLY REPORT**Construction and Capital Campaign Update:**

I plan to bring you up to date on the construction occurring on the Holy Name of Jesus Campus. To highlight the need for the campus improvements, I would like to share some Holy Name of Jesus history. Established in 1960 by members of St. Margaret Mary and St. Joan of Arc Parishes, Holy Name of Jesus Parish was founded and held its first services at Paxtonia School. Under the leadership of Holy Name's first pastor, Rev. George Rost, plans were made to raise money to build a church on 13 acres of land on Jonestown Road. The original building fund raised \$375,000 to build the church, social room, eight classrooms, and convent. Years later, the rectory was constructed in 1971 at a cost of \$32,000. In the early 1970's, Holy Name of Jesus added the football field, playgrounds, and an ice rink. In the late 1970's, a Capital Campaign raised funds to construct the school building (1978) and the gymnasium (1980). This historical perspective should remind you of the roots of our parish and cause you to reflect on the dedication and commitment of the early parishioners who founded Holy Name of Jesus Parish.

In 2019, Bishop Gainer granted Holy Name of Jesus permission to begin a new Capital Campaign to improve the parish. Father Quinlan's vision for the future continues as we build and modernize the facilities to keep Holy Name of Jesus a safe place to worship, provide exceptional Catholic education, and create ample space for our ministries to meet. The four phases of this project include the construction of a new rectory, remodel the 50-year-old rectory into a safe and secure business office with meeting rooms, modernize the social hall and lunchroom, and finally, finish the basement under the new church to handle special parish events.

Despite a worldwide pandemic, parishioners of Holy Name of Jesus have generously supported the current Capital Campaign. Together we have successfully raised over \$550,000 to make improvements to the campus. We have received enough money to begin our first project, the construction of the new rectory. A Groundbreaking Ceremony for the new rectory was held in October. After obtaining all the necessary permits and variances from the township, construction began in January. At this point, the rectory has its foundation and basement walls poured. In the coming weeks, you will see the framing begin and the building take shape. Pending unforeseen delays, we hope to have the rectory completed by June. Father Quinlan plans to have parishioners visit the new rectory once construction has been completed. He hopes to offer rectory tours following standard Covid-19 safety protocols.

We have much to be thankful for here at Holy Name of Jesus. Like the parishioners from 60 years ago, we are continuing the vision of our Parish for generations to come. Thank you for your attention today and continued financial support of the Capital Campaign.

Life Begins At Conception

It is an error to claim, "It's not a human, it's a fetus."

That would be like saying, "it's not a human, it's an infant," or, "It's not a human, it's an adolescent." These are category fallacies. The proper answer to these assertions would be, "Sure, it's a fetus, sure it's an infant, and sure it's an adolescent. It's a *human* fetus, a *human* infant, and a *human* adolescent." These are simply stages of development in the human life cycle. A human starts as an embryo, becomes a fetus, is born an infant, develops into a child, grows into an adolescent, matures into adulthood, and eventually dies. Scientifically and philosophically, there is no good reason to believe a human being is created at birth, because nothing is created at birth. At birth, a fetus simply changes location and changes its mode of acquiring food and dispensing waste, but at no point does the child become something entirely new or different. Life begins at conception and proceeds through its stages until death. From the moment of conception, the unborn are human beings.
