SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

On the second Sunday of Lent in each Lectionary cycle, the Gospel reading proclaims the story of Jesus' Transfiguration. This event is reported in each of the Synoptic Gospels—Matthew, Mark, and Luke. This year, in Lectionary Cycle B, we hear Mark's report of this event.

The context for Mark's Transfiguration story is similar to that found in both Matthew's and Luke's Gospel. The Transfiguration occurs after Peter's confession that Jesus is the Messiah and Jesus' prediction about his passion. After this, in each of these Gospels, there is also a discussion of the cost of discipleship.

In each case, Jesus takes three of his disciples—Peter, James, and John—to a high mountain. While they are there, Elijah and Moses appear with Jesus.

Elijah and Moses are significant figures in the history of Israel. Moses led the Israelites from slavery in Egypt and received from Yahweh the Ten Commandments. In appearing with Jesus at his Transfiguration, Moses represents the Law that guides the lives of the Jewish people. Elijah is remembered as one of the most important prophets of Israel who helped the Israelites stay faithful to Yahweh.

In his Transfiguration, we see an anticipation of the glory of Jesus' Resurrection. In each of the reports of the Transfiguration, Jesus instructs the disciples to keep secret what they have seen until after the Son of Man has risen from the dead. The disciples' confusion continues as they wonder what Jesus means by rising from the dead. The disciples cannot possibly understand Jesus' Transfiguration until they also witness his passion and death. We hear the story of Jesus' Transfiguration early in Lent, but we have the benefit of hindsight. In our hearing of it, we anticipate Jesus' Resurrection, even as we prepare to remember Jesus' passion and death.


Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) - Mondays at 7:00 p.m., September through Easter. Please contact the Parish Office for information.



Construction and Capital Campaign Update: Delivered at mass on the Feb 14th

I plan to bring you up to date on the construction occurring on the Holy Name of Jesus Campus. To highlight the need for the campus improvements, I would like to share some Holy Name of Jesus history. Established in 1960 by members of St. Margaret Mary and St. Joan of Arc Parishes, Holy Name of Jesus Parish was founded and held its first services at Paxtonia School. Under the leadership of Holy Name's first pastor, Rev. George Rost, plans were made to raise money to build a church on 13 acres of land on Jonestown Road. The original building fund raised \$375,000 to build the church, social room, eight classrooms, and convent. Years later, the rectory was constructed in 1971 at a cost of \$32,000. In the early 1970's, Holy Name of Jesus added the football field, playgrounds, and an ice rink. In the late 1970's, a Capital Campaign raised funds to construct the school building (1978) and the gymnasium (1980). This historical perspective should remind you of the roots of our parish and cause you to reflect on the dedication and commitment of the early parishioners who founded Holy Name of Jesus Parish.

In 2019, Bishop Gainer granted Holy Name of Jesus permission to begin a new Capital Campaign to improve the parish. Father Quinlan's vision for the future continues as we build and modernize the facilities to keep Holy Name of Jesus a safe place to worship, provide exceptional Catholic education, and create ample space for our ministries to meet. The four phases of this project include the construction of a new rectory, remodel the 50-year-old rectory into a safe and secure business office with meeting rooms, modernize the social hall and lunchroom, and finally, finish the basement under the new church to handle special parish events.

Despite a worldwide pandemic, parishioners of Holy Name of Jesus have generously supported the current Capital Campaign. Together we have successfully raised over \$550,000 to make improvements to the campus. We have received enough money to begin our first project, the construction of the new rectory. A Groundbreaking Ceremony for the new rectory was held in October. After obtaining all the necessary permits and variances from the township, construction began in January. At this point, the rectory has its foundation and basement walls poured. In the coming weeks, you will see the framing begin and the building take shape. Pending unforeseen delays, we hope to have the rectory completed by June. Father Quinlan plans to have parishioners visit the new rectory once construction has been completed. He hopes to offer rectory tours following standard Covid-19 safety protocols.

We have much to be thankful for here at Holy Name of Jesus. Like the parishioners from 60 years ago, we are continuing the vision of our Parish for generations to come. Thank you for your attention today and continued financial support of the Capital Campaign.

These are simply stages of development in the human life cycle. A human starts as an embryo, becomes a fetus, is born an infant, develops into a child, grows into an adolescent, matures into adulthood, and eventually dies. 
