#### **READING:**

Students entering Grade 8 are required to read the following book:

**The Outsiders** (S. E. Hinton) – Students will be assessed on the story and should be prepared for in-class discussion.

**Assignment**: Students must choose one (1) additional book from the list below and complete the *Free Choice Book* (form included):

- Night (Eli Weisel)
- Surviving Hitler (Andrea Warren)
- Stargirl (Jerry Spinelli)
- Fever 1793 (Laurie Halse Anderson)

**To prepare for National History Day**, students are required to begin basic research related to the theme, 'Debate and Diplomacy in History'; success, failure, consequents. Please visit the National History Day website at <a href="https://www.nhd.org">www.nhd.org</a> for a detailed explanation regarding the meaning of this year's theme. Students are not locked in to this topic for their National History Day projects – this assignment is intended to generate in-class Social Studies discussions.

Diplomacy means the art and practive of conducting negotiations between nations. It is a skill in handling affairs, business and practices without arousing hostility. It means handling conflicts with artfulness, poise and delicacy.

Students must write a good paragraph (5-8 sentences) on the following points:

1.

- 1. Who was involved?
- 2. What was the cause of the conflict, and what steps were taken to overcome the obstacle?
  - 3. What was the outcome?
  - 4. Was there a resolution for both sides?
  - 5. How was history changed?
  - 6. Who are famous diplomats?

- 2. Watch The History Channel.
- 3. While on vacation, look for historic sites where a conflict might have needed diplomacy, or a debate was held.
