

THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

As Jesus stands in the synagogue, he reads from the scroll handed to him; it contains the words of the prophet Isaiah. At this early moment in his ministry, Jesus announces his mission in continuity with Israel's prophetic tradition. This reading from Isaiah defines Jesus' ministry. We will find more evidence of this as we continue to read from Luke's Gospel throughout the year. Jesus' ministry will include bringing glad tidings to the poor, liberty to captives, healing to the sick, freedom to the oppressed, and proclaiming a year acceptable to the Lord.

Through this text from Isaiah, Jesus announces God's salvation. The "year acceptable to the Lord" is a reference to the Jewish tradition of Sabbath years and jubilee. The Sabbath year was observed every seventh year. It was a year of rest when land was left fallow and food stores were to be shared equally with all. A year of Jubilee was celebrated every fiftieth year, the conclusion of seven cycles of Sabbath years. It was a year of renewal in which debts were forgiven and slaves were freed.

This tradition of Jubilee is the framework for God's promise of salvation. And yet in Jesus, something new begins. Jesus not only announces God's salvation, he brings this salvation about in his person. Jesus is Yahweh's Anointed One, filled with the Spirit of God. The Kingdom of God is now at hand. It is made present in Jesus, in his life, death, and Resurrection. Jesus will send the Holy Spirit so that the Kingdom of God can be fulfilled.

The Holy Spirit is Jesus' gift to the Church. The Holy Spirit enables the Church to continue the mission of Jesus. When we do what Jesus did—bring glad tidings to the poor, liberty to captives, healing to the sick, and freedom to the oppressed—we serve the Kingdom of God.

Please contact the parish office for additional information or questions. Godparents must be practicing Catholics, age 16 or older, have already received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, and, if married, married in accord with Catholic Church Law.

Matrimony: Diocesan Common Policy requires nine to twelve months advance notification of the priest or deacon and attendance at marriage preparation. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) - Mondays at 7:00 p.m., September through Easter. Please contact the Parish Office for information.

Visitation of the Sick: Please notify the Parish Office when a member of the Parish is in the hospital or if someone is unable to attend Mass and wishes to receive Communion.

Persons with Celiac Disease: Persons with this challenge are usually unable to receive the normal wheat host used for Mass. We provide a separate chalice for the reception of Holy Communion at each Mass. As the Eucharistic Ministers are receiving Holy Communion at the altar, please come forward to the front of the Church and someone will bring the chalice for you to receive the Precious Blood.

Parish Update for 2022

I am so very grateful for the kindness of our parishioners. Repeatedly you have stepped up to meet the needs of our parish. Even now we are starting to recover from the pandemic as more return to active participation in the parish life. Understandably some do still need to be cautious with health concerns.

I want to give you an update on our capital projects. The first was the building of the new residence. This was completed in June and we promptly moved in. We had the opportunity for an open house for all to see this beautiful home for the parish priests. This past summer we did have four of us there for a bit as we had a seminarian for the summer and as well as a visit by Father Rossi. The original budget for the project was in the neighborhood of \$1.2 million. Our final cost came in at \$900,000 for everything from demolition, land development, utilities, building and some furnishings. We benefited with some very nice gifts of furnishings from parishioners who were downsizing. Both our architect Richard Mulá and our builder Triple Crown are to be congratulated for their excellent work.

We are now ready for the second project, the renovation of the former rectory for parish offices. As we looked at the building there are some areas that needed attention. The basement is filled with mold from years of bad drainage, the roof will need to be replaced and we will have some interior work to repurpose some of the former living quarters back into office and meeting rooms. That work will begin this month.

The third project will be the renovation of the school cafeteria/social hall. We hope to be able to look forward to this for the summer. Preliminary meetings on this will likely take place later this month.

Thanks to your generosity the new residence is fully paid for and we have the funds to begin the next. Fr. Edward J. Quinlan
