

SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's gospel reading is a continuation of the teaching that began in last Sunday's gospel. We continue to hear Jesus' Sermon on the Plain. Recall that in Luke's Gospel, this teaching is addressed to Jesus' disciples. This is in contrast to the parallel found in Matthew's Gospel, the Sermon on the Mount, in which Jesus' words are addressed to both the disciples and to the crowds.

These words from Jesus' teaching are familiar to us. They constitute the crux and the challenge of what it means to be a disciple: Love your enemies, turn the other cheek, give to those who ask, do unto others, lend without expecting repayment, judge not lest you be judged.

There are several similarities between Luke's and Matthew's report of Jesus' great teaching. Both begin with the Beatitudes. There are, however, differences in language and nuance. For example, Matthew presents this portion of the teaching as a contrast between Jesus' teaching and the teachings of the law and the prophets. This is in keeping with Matthew's concern to address his predominantly Jewish audience. It is likely that Luke omits this contrast because it was unnecessary for the Gentile believers for whom Luke is writing.

Another point of contrast between Matthew and Luke's presentation is the terminology. In Luke, Jesus contrasts the behavior of his followers with the behavior of "sinners." In Matthew, Jesus contrasts the behavior desired with the behavior of tax collectors and Gentiles. Matthew concludes the teaching about love of enemies with the admonition to be perfect as God is perfect; Luke concludes by emphasizing God's mercy.

In both Gospels, Jesus' words challenge those who would follow him to be more like God. God loves us beyond our expectations, beyond anything we can possibly imagine. In response to God's love, we are to love as God loves, beyond expectations and with a depth beyond imagining.



Eucharistic Miracles of the World

Exactly what are Eucharistic miracles? The Catholic Church has always taught that at Mass, through the words directed by Jesus as found in the Bible when spoken by the priest, that the bread and wine offered up are transformed and become the actual body and blood of Jesus. Evidence of the continuum of this belief through the ages can be found by examining the writings of the early church fathers where, for example, St. Justin Martyr in The First Apology of Justin written around 150 A.D. wrote, ".... this food is called among us Eucharistia [the Eucharist],For not as common bread and common drink do we receive these; but....we have been taught that the food which is blessed by the prayer of His word, and from which our blood and flesh by transmutation are nourished, is the flesh and blood of that Jesus who was made flesh...." For the first few centuries of Christianity there was no disagreement among the church fathers of this teaching in the church. This teaching continues to be passed on in the church today, where at every mass the miracle occurs, and bread and wine are changed into the body and blood of Christ. Eucharistic miracles then are a manifestation where the consecrated bread and wine, the body and blood of Christ normally visible to us as bread and wine, change their outward appearance. Sometimes they show themselves as actual flesh and blood, other times they become luminous or even levitate, at other times images appear on the Bread or other extraordinary events take place.



One of the most famous Eucharistic miracles occurred at the Church of St. Francis in Lanciano, Italy in 750 A.D. Here, during the Mass and to the astonishment of the priest and all present, the bread and wine turned physically into visible flesh and blood. The miracle has been studied numerous times over the centuries. Most recently the World Health Organization in

1973 spent 15 months and administered over 500 tests and found the flesh to be that of human heart tissue, the blood samples were type AB (same as that found on the shroud of Turin) and both the blood and the flesh reacted as if they were fresh tissue. The miraculous flesh and blood can still be viewed today at the Church in Lanciano, Italy. This miracle is one of the 126 miracles described in the photo exhibit of The Eucharistic Miracles of the World.

The display will be at Holy Name of Jesus for our annual Eucharistic Devotions March 5 to 8.




