

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

In each of the three Synoptic Gospels, after his baptism, Jesus is reported to have spent forty days in the desert, fasting and praying. In Luke and in Matthew, the devil presents three temptations to Jesus. The devil tempts Jesus to use his power to appease his hunger, he offers Jesus all the kingdoms of the world if Jesus will worship him, and he tempts Jesus to put God's promise of protection to the test. In each case, Jesus resists, citing words from Scripture to rebuke the devil's temptation.

Each temptation that Jesus faces offers insight into the spirituality we hope to develop as we keep the forty days of the Season of Lent. We can trust God to provide for our material needs. We worship God because God alone has dominion over us and our world. We can trust God to be faithful to his promises. Jesus' rejection of the devil's temptations shows that he will not put God to the test. Grounding himself on the Word and authority of Scripture, Jesus rebukes the devil by his confidence in God's protection and faithfulness.

This Gospel highlights for us one of the central themes of the Season of Lent. We are dependent upon God for all that we have and all that we are. Anything that leads us to reject this dependency or to distrust its sufficiency, is a temptation from the devil.

Luke ends his report of Jesus' temptation in the desert by noting that the devil departs for a time. The implication is that the devil will return. Jesus knows that he will be tempted again in the Garden of Gethsemane. The depth of Jesus' trust in God is shown most fully when Jesus rejects the temptation to turn away from the task God has given to him. Jesus' final rebuke of the devil is his sacrifice on the Cross.

Jesus' responses to the temptations of the devil teach us how we can respond to temptation. As we start our journey through Lent, this Sunday's Gospel calls us to adopt the same confidence that Jesus had in the face of temptation: God's word alone will suffice, God's promise of protection can be trusted, and God alone is God.

Godparents must be practicing Catholics, age 16 or older, have already received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, and, if married, married in accord with Catholic Church Law.

Matrimony: Diocesan Common Policy requires nine to twelve months advance notification of the priest or deacon and attendance at marriage preparation. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) - Mondays at 7:00 p.m., September through Easter. Please contact the Parish Office for information.

Visitation of the Sick: Please notify the Parish Office when a member of the Parish is in the hospital or if someone is unable to attend Mass and wishes to receive Communion.

Persons with Celiac Disease: Persons with this challenge are usually unable to receive the normal wheat host used for Mass. We provide a separate chalice for the reception of Holy Communion at each Mass. As the Eucharistic Ministers are receiving Holy Communion at the altar, please come forward to the front of the Church and someone will bring the chalice for you to receive the Precious Blood.



Eucharistic Miracles of the World


Exactly what are Eucharistic miracles? The Catholic Church has always taught that at Mass, through the words directed by Jesus as found in the Bible when spoken by the priest, that the bread and wine offered up are transformed and become the actual body and blood of Jesus. Evidence of the continuum of this belief through the ages can be found by examining the writings of the early church fathers where, for example, St. Justin Martyr in The First Apology of Justin written around 150 A.D. wrote, ".... this food is called among us Eucharistia [the Eucharist],For not as common bread and common drink do we receive these; but....we have been taught that the food which is blessed by the praver of His word, and from which our blood and flesh by transmutation are nourished, is the flesh and blood of that Jesus who was made flesh " For the first few centuries of Christianity there was no disagreement among the church fathers of this teaching in the church. This teaching continues to be passed on in the church today, where at every mass the miracle occurs, and bread and wine are changed into the body and blood of Christ. Eucharistic miracles then are a manifestation where the consecrated bread and wine, the body and blood of Christ normally visible to us as bread and wine, change their outward appearance. Sometimes they show themselves as actual flesh and blood, other times they become luminous or even levitate, at other times images appear on the Bread or other extraordinary events take place.



One of the most famous Eucharistic miracles occurred at the Church of St. Francis in Lanciano, Italy in 750 A.D. Here, during the Mass and to the astonishment of the priest and all present, the bread and wine turned physically into visible flesh and blood. The miracle has been studied numerous times over the centuries. Most recently the World Health Organization in

1973 spent 15 months and administered over 500 tests and found the flesh to be that of human heart tissue, the blood samples were type AB (same as that found on the shroud of Turin) and both the blood and the flesh reacted as if they were fresh tissue. The miraculous flesh and blood can still be viewed today at the Church in Lanciano, Italy. This miracle is one of the 126 miracles described in the photo exhibit of The Eucharistic Miracles of the World.

The display will be at Holy Name of Jesus for our annual Eucharistic Devotions March 6 to 8.
