

"God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Philippians 2: 9 - 11)

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

The disciples have brought to shore a tremendous catch of fish that Jesus has directed them to find. But once on the shore, they see that Jesus has already prepared fish and bread on a charcoal fire. Jesus directs the disciples to bring their catch of fish as well. Jesus is host at the meal that follows, feeding the disciples the bread and fish. In this detail we see allusions to the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and the fishes told in John 6.

There are also allusions in the Gospel to our gathering for the celebration of the Mass. In the Eucharist, we too are fed by Jesus in the bread and wine that have become his very Body and Blood. We also find in this story insight about the Presentation of the Gifts at Mass. The gifts we bring to the altar, bread and wine, are made from gifts that God gave first to us: grain and grapes, the fruit of the earth. God has no need of anything further. Yet God accepts the offering we bring—bread and wine, "the work of human hands"—and transforms our offering into the gift of his very presence.

After the meal, Jesus directs himself to Simon Peter. The community of John's Gospel probably looked down on Peter because of his denial of Jesus. This dialogue with Simon Peter is a reversal of Peter's three denials. Peter is forgiven. Having been restored to friendship with Jesus, Simon Peter is sent on a mission. "Feed my lambs . . . Tend my sheep . . . Feed my sheep." These commands indicate that Peter is to be as Jesus, even unto sacrificing for the flock. As Jesus has fed Peter in this meal and as Jesus feeds us in the Eucharist, so he also sends us to follow him, asking that we offer our lives in service and sacrifice.

Godparents must be practicing Catholics, age 16 or older, have already received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, and, if married, married in accord with Catholic Church Law.

Matrimony: Diocesan Common Policy requires nine to twelve months advance notification of the priest or deacon and attendance at marriage preparation. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Persons with Celiac Disease: Persons with this challenge are usually unable to receive the normal wheat host used for Mass. We provide a separate chalice for the reception of Holy Communion at each Mass. As the Eucharistic Ministers are receiving Holy Communion at the altar, please come forward to the front of the Church and someone will bring the chalice for you to receive the Precious Blood.



Its 11pm, Do You Know Where Your Children Are?

This message would often run on the TV when I was growing up as a public service spot. It did prompt parents to think about what their children were up to on a Friday or Saturday night.

How much do you know about your child's school? Not 11pm, but weekdays between 8am and 3pm. What are they learning, and more importantly, what values are being communicated? Many of you are aware of the controversy in Florida where the legislature passed a law to prohibit children in grades K to 3 from being indoctrinated on matters of sexuality and sexual identity. The law places the responsibility for such formation at early ages on parents and not public school personnel. The Disney Corporation, of all things, has embarked on crusade against the law, prompting a reply from the legislature. How did we get here, that Disney, the family friendly entertainment company, thinks it's abhorrent to trust parents with the most basic elements of their own children's moral formation.

To understand, one must see what is taking place in education today. Colleges and Universities have become bastions of woke ideology, including all forms of sexual and gender confusion. No more boys and girls, it's all just in your mind and all fluid. We can be whatever we want to be. These same institutions are training teachers and have for generations. Just to give you an example of where some educators are at, there is a school district in Wisconsin where the staff is being trained to be on the lookout for transgendered students, yes in the earliest grades. They are to encourage the child to transition, but keep it secret from parents. The materials note: "parents must first earn the right to know their child's gender". You see, if parents are not supportive, then we educators must protect the child from them. This was not crazy San Francisco; it was in Eau Claire, Wisconsin.

If it is happening in Wisconsin, what about Harrisburg?
