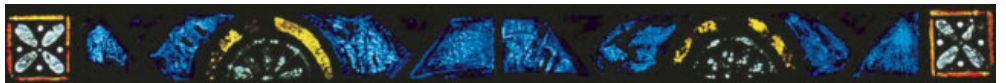

SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

This portion of John's Gospel comes near the end of the first of four chapters that make up Jesus' long farewell discourse at the Last Supper. This section of chapter 14 actually sums up the themes of the opening of the discourse: the Christian's life is not shaped by Jesus' absence but by God's abiding presence; God's presence overcomes anxiety about God's absence; and the present holds in it the seeds of a fresh future shaped by love, not fear.

These verses also contain a glimpse of some of the other themes of the farewell discourse: Jesus' relationship with the Father and the disciples' relationship to Jesus connect the disciples to the Father as well. Jesus promises to send an Advocate or intercessor who will remind the disciples of everything that Jesus taught them and bring them peace.

Jesus is preparing his disciples in advance for his absence so that they will continue to believe in him and not feel all alone after his return to the Father. After the initial excitement of his Easter appearances, Jesus will remain with his followers in a very different way throughout the centuries.

As our celebration of the Easter season is coming to an end, the liturgy reminds us that Jesus remains with us through the Holy Spirit, who teaches us everything we need to know, reminds us of all that Jesus taught, and brings us peace.

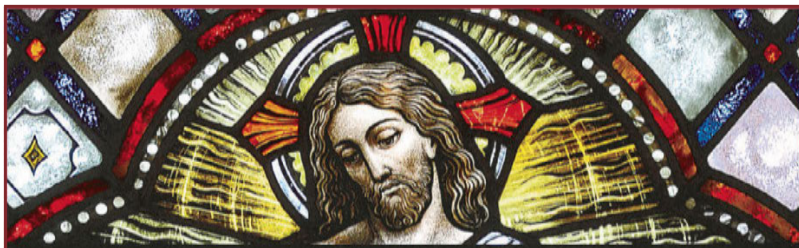
Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) - Mondays at 7:00 p.m., September through Easter. Please contact the Parish Office for information.

**Roe versus Wade**

Since the 1973 Supreme Court decision that ruled state laws against abortion unconstitutional there have been many challenges to the decision. States tried to limit abortion with incremental laws, some being upheld, others struck down. Some have sought the long game of going to the very judicial philosophy of the members of the court. From the reports of the leaked draft of the current court case it seems that after all these years the court may be looking to displace the earlier ruling, which would in effect send the question back to the states for a decision. I can think of two other court rulings that were eventually changed or overturned, the Dred Scott decision in 1857 and Plessy v. Ferguson in 1896. The first affirmed slavery and the second segregation. Both rulings were unjust from inception, and the corrections were costly.

Needless to say, the prospect of a change has enflamed the passions of supporters of abortion. I have often wondered how people view the past 50 years. By all accounts about 60 million children have been lost. Is that ok for our country? Millions of women are left to deal with the aftermath and personal pain of having had an abortion. Is that ok for our country? The practice of abortion has fallen especially hard on the African American community. For example, the 2013 statistics for New York City are stark. Black women gave birth to 24,108 children. That same year black women had 29,007 abortions. Do black children really matter in our country, or do we actually agree with the racist views of Margaret Sanger. For those who carry signs and chant in support of abortion do they understand the consequences of what they are demanding?

There are proposals in Congress to replace the court decision with new laws that would permit the taking of a child up to the moment of birth. This is a measure far more extreme than the original court decision. We may have a chance to revisit this whole question of abortion state by state. In seeking guidance, I think Jesus would be in favor of life.

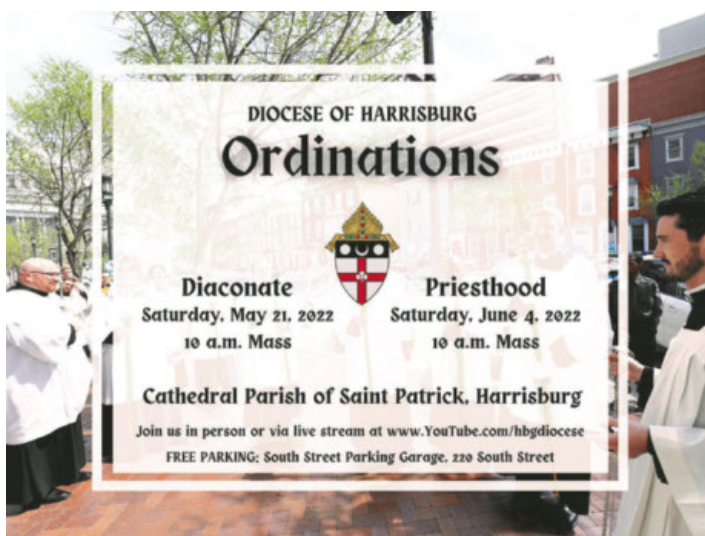
