

#### FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's Gospel begins immediately after the final verse in last Sunday's Gospel. After strong language about the difficulties of discipleship, Jesus immediately appoints 72 people to go ahead of him to every town and place he plans to visit, proclaiming that the Kingdom of God is at hand. He sends them in pairs. In the Law of Moses two witnesses were needed for a testimony to be credible. It was probably also a safer way to travel.

Jesus admits it will be difficult, that he is sending them out like lambs among wolves. Yet they are to bring nothing with them, not even a money bag or sandals. They are to greet no one on the way so as not to be distracted from their mission. When they enter a house, their message is simply "peace." The response they will receive may be positive or negative. Either way, they are to know that the Kingdom of God is at hand. They are not to demand special treatment but eat and drink whatever is given them. They are to stay in one house and are not to look around for one that provides better accommodations. They are to heal the sick as a sign that the Kingdom of God is at hand for them. Like Jesus' miracles, healing is a sign of the coming of the kingdom. If the town will not receive them, they are to shake the dust from their feet and move on. Even in the case of such rejection they should know that the Kingdom of God is at hand.

When they return from their journeys, they are rejoicing because their mission has been successful. Demons were under their power because of Jesus' name. Jesus may have sent them out as lambs among wolves, but at the conclusion of this passage he assures them that they have been given power over the enemy and nothing will harm them, not even serpents and scorpions.

A key theme of today's Gospel and last Sunday's Gospel is discipleship—its challenges, its difficulties, and its rewards. Sharing in the mission of Jesus is difficult, but everyone is called to do it, not just some professionals trained for ministry. Even for us today, the harvest is plentiful. We should pray to the master of the harvest to send out workers for his harvest.

Godparents must be practicing Catholics, age 16 or older, have already received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, and, if married, married in accord with Catholic Church Law.

**Matrimony:** Diocesan Common Policy requires nine to twelve months advance notification of the priest or deacon and attendance at marriage preparation. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) -** Mondays at 7:00 p.m., September through Easter. Please contact the Parish Office for information.

**Visitation of the Sick:** Please notify the Parish Office when a member of the Parish is in the hospital or if someone is unable to attend Mass and wishes to receive Communion.

**Persons with Celiac Disease:** Persons with this challenge are usually unable to receive the normal wheat host used for Mass. We provide a separate chalice for the reception of Holy Communion at each Mass. As the Eucharistic Ministers are receiving Holy Communion at the altar, please come forward to the front of the Church and someone will bring the chalice for you to receive the Precious Blood.







## America, Land of the Free and Home of the Brave

As we prepare to observe our Independence Day celebration it is worth reflecting on just what we are celebrating. A read of the Declaration of Independence is recommended. That document, severing our ties to England, lays out in detail the rights of persons including their right to dissolve political bonds deemed destructive of said rights and to form a new government. In laying out the case for the formation of a new government they noted that the central role of government is to respect and secure the inalienable rights of its people.

What is important to note is the source of the citizen's rights as described in the document, namely the Laws of Nature and Nature's God. As both the author of nature and the human person, whom He created in His own image and likeness, God is the ultimate source of our rights. We are not dependent on the good graces of government, but the government is dependent on us for all its authority. It is an interesting reflection, especially in light of the current drift towards socialism. In many respects this vision is the polar opposite of socialism, for in that political form of government the state is central and is above its citizens. They have only what rights and obligations the state grants or demands of them. History notes that socialist countries have failed economically and have routinely imprisoned their citizens who object to their dictates. Gulags and prison camps are their popular public works projects. Just ask our Cuban neighbors. Socialism, as the by-product of communism, has at its philosophical roots a view of man without reference to God, and ultimately rejects God completely. Absent God, from where do our rights originate?

We have been blessed with the freedoms that are at the heart of our country's foundation. It has provided us with the ability to live out our faith and to promote that faith to others in the mission of evangelization. It has encouraged us to live in harmony and charity with all of our neighbors, respecting their rights to faith, including those who profess no faith. People who are free are able to bring their own creativity to bear and our country can bear witness to that with its extraordinary successes.

Finally, we must note that this document, signed on July 4, 1776, was not the end, but rather the beginning of several difficult years of war to achieve the vision. Many others have also stepped forward in generation after generation to protect what was envisioned that July 4th so long ago. Without the brave, we would not be here and will not remain.
