"God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Philippians 2: 9 - 11)



TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Meals played an important role in the society in which Jesus lived. More than a time for sharing nourishment, they were a time to share ideas and to model different aspects of social relationships. In Luke's Gospel, the places that a person ate (at the home of a tax collector, 5:29), the people with whom a person ate (sinners, 5:30), whether a person washed before eating (11:38), and, as is the case here, the place that a person sits while eating are all important. The narrator says Jesus tells a parable, but it is really wise advice to both guests and hosts about finding true happiness at the heavenly banquet.

Jesus warns guests to wait before taking their places at the table lest they be asked to move if someone more important arrives. This is more than just a lesson about dinner etiquette. It is advice on how to find your true place in the Kingdom of God. Jesus advises hosts not to invite people who would be expected to repay them to dinner but to invite those who could not repay: the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. This is where real blessings can be found.

In these sayings, Luke gives us not only advice on how to approach the end times but also on how to live according to Jesus' vision of a good society. Luke's Gospel also advises us how the Church must be part of bringing about this society. It is yet another example in Luke's Gospel of the reversal the kingdom brings about.



Back to School, Lunch as a New Battleground

On May 5, 2022 the US Department of Agriculture, the federal agency that oversees the Federal School Lunch Program, issued a memo requiring all participating school programs to update their non-discrimination policies based on the Biden administration policy of including sexual orientation and gender identity in everything the federal government does. Holy Name of Jesus School received this notice along with every other lunch program in the state. Needless to say, not only does the new federal definition fly in the face of biology, it conflicts with our Christian faith.

The threat was that any institution that failed to comply would not be approved for the new school year. Fortunately, at least one Christian school has already challenged this policy. The Grant Park Christian Academy in Tampa, FL filed suit and won their case. Arguing for their religious liberty, the school argued that to accept such additional definitions would violate basic tenets of their faith. The case resulted in their application being approved, without their changing the discrimination policy to meet the new federal guidelines. In our diocese all of our schools, including HNJ, submitted a reservation of rights letter to advise the state that we retain our religious rights and identity. We hope that this first court challenge to the changed definitions will let our programs be approved as they currently operate. It would be a sad day if children were denied a good nutrition program.




