

#### TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In chapter 14 of Luke's Gospel, Jesus is speaking to people gathered at the table about the difficulties of following him. This group of people is suspicious about Jesus, looking to catch him doing something wrong. Jesus speaks to them in parables, emphasizing that although there is a right way to be a disciple and enter into the kingdom of his Father, it is a difficult path to follow. Many, even some of the guests at the table, reject the invitation. So Jesus turns to the crowds and speaks to them of discipleship. Jesus explains that, when it comes to making a choice for the Kingdom of God, nothing can get in the way. When Jesus describes "hating" one's father and mother, he is not talking about feelings. Rather, he is emphasizing very strongly that choosing to be a disciple means that everything else-family, money, your own life-must come second. In Matthew's version of this story (Matthew 10:37), Jesus refers not to "hating" father or mother, but to loving them more than Jesus. Jesus makes it very clear that being a disciple is not easy. It means to bear one's own cross. These difficult sayings of Jesus are followed by two brief parables (a person constructing a tower and a king marching into battle) that make an obvious point-don't start what you cannot finish. Discipleship is difficult and is something we can commit to only if we are prepared to put the Kingdom of God before everything else. - Excerpted from Sunday Connection, Loyola Press

Godparents must be practicing Catholics, age 16 or older, have already received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, and, if married, married in accord with Catholic Church Law.

**Matrimony:** Diocesan Common Policy requires nine to twelve months advance notification of the priest or deacon and attendance at marriage preparation. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) -** Mondays at 7:00 p.m., September through Easter. Please contact the Parish Office for information.

**Visitation of the Sick:** Please notify the Parish Office when a member of the Parish is in the hospital or if someone is unable to attend Mass and wishes to receive Communion.

**Persons with Celiac Disease:** Persons with this challenge are usually unable to receive the normal wheat host used for Mass. We provide a separate chalice for the reception of Holy Communion at each Mass. As the Eucharistic Ministers are receiving Holy Communion at the altar, please come forward to the front of the Church and someone will bring the chalice for you to receive the Precious Blood.

- Classes for three-year-olds, four-year-olds, and kindergarten students will begin Sunday, September 25, 10:15- 11:15 a.m.


# Faithful Stewards...Building Our Future

CANNED FOOD COLLECTION - The Knights of Columbus have closed the books on the 2021-2022 Food for Families Program and we are happy to report that through the generosity of our parishioners, we have distributed 25,749 pounds of food to the needy in our community. As a result of these efforts, the parish donated 10,521 pounds of food to needy parishioners; 5,723 pounds to St. Francis Food Pantry; 5,250 pounds to Race Track Ministries at Penn National; and 4,255 to the Silence of Mary Home. Since we began participating in the Knights of Columbus National Food for Families Program, the Knights have collected and dispersed over 377,000 pounds (approx. 168 tons) of canned goods and food stuffs. The Knights would like to acknowledge and thank all the faithful of our parish who have made this important service a reality. Our next collection will be held the weekend of September 10 & 11. The trailer will be parked on the sidewalk between the church and school and the wagon will be placed in its usual location. Please continue to support this worthwhile cause.


