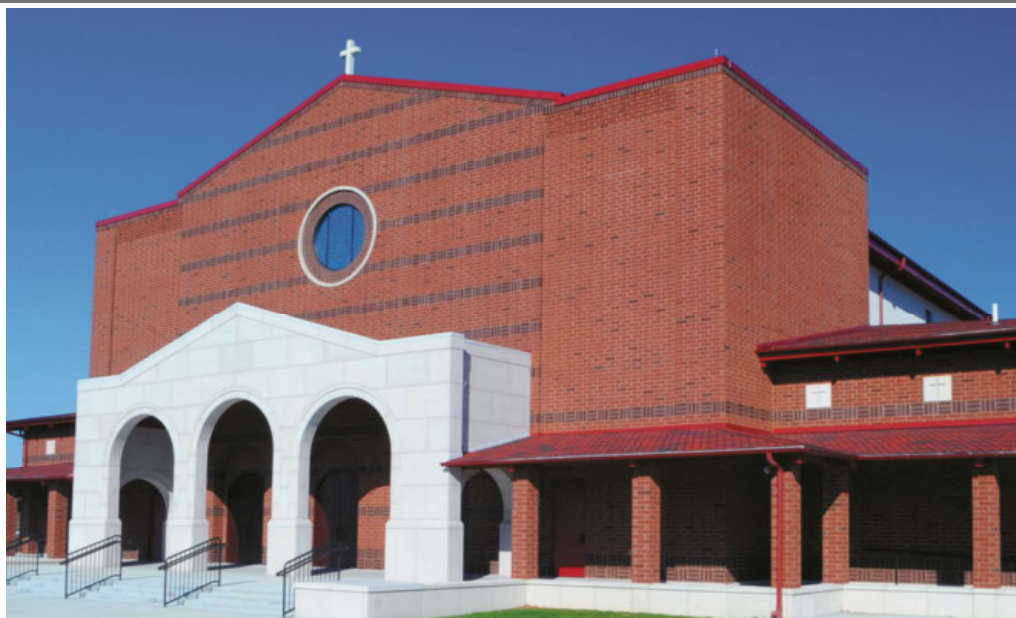
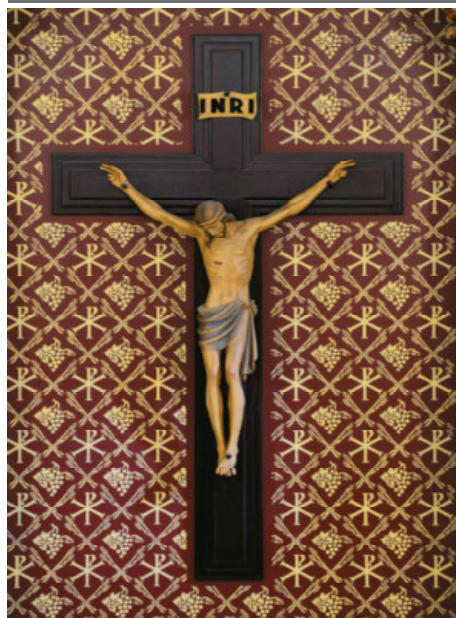

THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In the context of Luke, today's Gospel appears near the end of Jesus' teaching in Jerusalem, just prior to the events that will lead to his crucifixion. His warnings and predictions are ominous but can be read in many ways.

To those who first heard Luke's Gospel, those may have been words of encouragement. The destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem by the Romans was history (70 A.D.); Luke's Gospel, Catholic scholars propose, was written between 80 and 90 A.D. His audience was probably Gentile Christians. Luke here tries to interpret the fall of Jerusalem for them and to locate it in God's plans for humankind (salvation history). At the same time, Luke is suggesting to his audience that there will be a considerable elapse of time before Jesus' final coming. Luke's listeners have likely seen much upheaval and are anxious to know if these are the signs of Jesus' coming. Luke is urging greater patience.

In the second part of today's Gospel, Jesus warns that his followers will face persecution for their beliefs. Luke presents persecution as an opportunity for the followers of Jesus for "It will lead to your giving testimony" (Luke 21:13). In persecution God's wisdom and power will be shown in the example of followers of Jesus. Perseverance in the face of persecution will lead to their salvation.

Here Jesus is assuring his followers that God is present to all believers, even in times of trouble. Ultimately, Jesus will witness to this with his own death. As disciples of Jesus, we try to follow his example, trusting in God's mercy and protection, even when we are facing difficulties.

SACRAMENTS

Baptisms are held every Sunday after the 12:00 noon Mass. Baptismal Registration forms can be found in the Parish Office or on our website. Please contact the parish office for additional information or questions. Godparents must be practicing Catholics, age 16 or older, have already received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, and, if married, married in accord with Catholic Church Law.

Matrimony: Diocesan Common Policy requires nine to twelve months advance notification of the priest or deacon and attendance at marriage preparation. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) - Mondays at 7:00 p.m., September through Easter. Please contact the Parish Office for information.

Visitation of the Sick: Please notify the Parish Office when a member of the Parish is in the hospital or if someone is unable to attend Mass and wishes to receive Communion.

Persons with Celiac Disease: Persons with this challenge are usually unable to receive the normal wheat host used for Mass. We provide a separate chalice for the reception of Holy Communion at each Mass. As the Eucharistic Ministers are receiving Holy Communion at the altar, please come forward to the front of the Church and someone will bring the chalice for you to receive the Precious Blood.

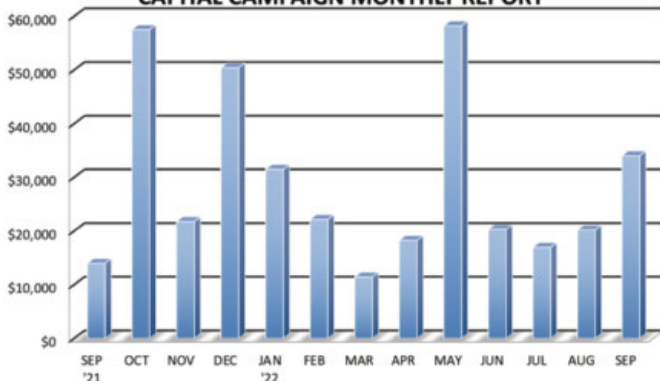

WHAT IS TRUTH?

In the Passion account of St. John there is a conversation between Jesus and Pilate. Jesus states under questioning that "This is why I was born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth." Pilate's response: "What is truth?". In light of our current culture it is a valid question. There are two radically different understandings of the word truth. For much of the contemporary culture truth is what I want a thing to be. In philosophy we would call that subjectivism. I, as the subject or person, determine what is true for me whereas it may be different for you as a different subject. I would suggest that for most of western culture truth was defined in a very different way, namely, *truth is the conformity of the mind with reality*. A position articulated by St. Thomas Aquinas and others before him. Reality is understood as an objective fact we seek to understand, not something open to various personal interpretations.

All modern science is based on this philosophical understanding. Reality is what we study, analyze, describe and base our judgements on. A certain piece of steel, of a particular composition and structure will be able to bear a certain weight. If not, our bridges would collapse and nothing in our technology would function. Reality exists all on its own and it is not contingent on what I may think (actually it is contingent on what God thinks). The steel beam holds not because I think it will hold or want it to hold, but because it does, that is its nature. It is true for the steel beam and for all realities, including biology. Sadly, because some areas of life have become politicized, we are told that what we see before us is not real or true. We are told we must play along with the charade or risk losing our career or job. Lives of young people are being grossly distorted as adults let them play out a fantasy, sometimes even helping to create the fantasy. Children are being mutilated (healthy organs removed or medically suppressed) for this fantasy. In some places parents are purposely kept in the dark by school personnel. If indeed a person suffers from a serious disconnect between what they are biologically and their desire to be something different they deserve our support and assistance. Pretending they are different does not help address the underlying problem. What has become of truth? I always thought that the truth will set us free.

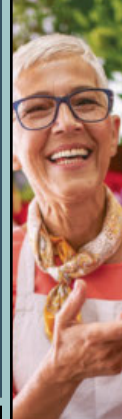

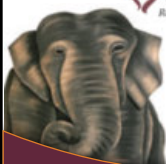
