"God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Philippians 2: 9 - 11)

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

In each of the three Synoptic Gospels (Mark, Matthew, and Luke), after Jesus' baptism by John, Jesus is reported to have gone to the desert to fast and pray for 40 days. In each case, while in the desert, Jesus is tempted by the devil.

Matthew and Luke give more detail than Mark does, but each one tells how the devil tempts Jesus in the desert. In Matthew, as in Luke, the devil presents three temptations to Jesus. The devil tempts Jesus to use his power to appease his hunger; he tempts Jesus to put God's promise of protection to the test; and he offers Jesus all of the kingdoms of the world if Jesus will worship the devil. In each case, Jesus resists the temptation, rebuking the devil with words from Scripture.

The account of Jesus' temptation in the desert is filled with allusions and parallels to the Old Testament, including the story of the people of Israel. The Israelites spent 40 years wandering in the desert in Exodus, for example, and Jesus spends 40 days in the desert. As the Israelites were tempted during the Exodus, so too is Jesus tempted.

Each temptation offers insight into both God and the human condition. Jesus' rejection of the temptations shows that he will not put God to the test. Grounding himself on the word and authority of Scripture, Jesus rebukes the devil, confident in God's protection and faithfulness.

As we start our journey through Lent, our Sunday readings call us to adopt the same confidence that Jesus had in the face of temptation: God's word alone will suffice; God's promise of protection can be trusted; God alone is God.



BULLETIN DEADLINE

Submissions for the March 5 bulletin are due in writing to the parish office no later than Monday, February 27 at 12:00 noon.

Dear Parishioners,

As you are aware from the publicized reports, the Final Order in the Bankruptcy Action involving the Diocese of Harrisburg has been issued. You will have heard that our Parishes and Schools will be contributing toward this total Settlement and I write this to explain how this has come about.

In February of 2020, our Diocese filed this Bankruptcy Action. Bishop Gainer explained at that time that this course was necessary to ensure the continued viability of our Diocese in light of the potential costs of litigation and judgments that could be entered against it as a result of claims of Sexual Abuse.

About a month later, at a meeting of our Diocesan Deans, who are Pastors chosen to serve as leaders of groups of Parishes that comprise Deaneries, it was explained that the Order discharging all claims that would be issued at the conclusion of the Bankruptcy Proceeding would only apply to the Diocese, since the Diocese was the "Debtor" in the Bankruptcy Action. Therefore, even after the conclusion of the Bankruptcy Case, Parishes and High Schools, each a separate legal entity, could still potentially be sued. The Deans voiced concern about this since any potential claim against a Parish, even if unfounded, could result in a catastrophic financial loss.

The Deans were advised of the possibility of their forming an "Ad-Hoc Committee of Non-Debtor Related Entities" for purposes of protecting our Parishes and Schools and in June, 2020, the Deans, along with representatives of our High Schools, Catholic Charities and the Pennsylvania Catholic Conference, created such a Committee, of which I have served as a member.

The Committee secured an Attorney, independent from the Diocese, and acted during the Bankruptcy Action to ensure that our Parishes and Schools would be protected. As reported, this Committee will pay \$2,000,000 toward the Settlement. Each of the Pastors from all our Parishes agreed to this proposal and because of this universal agreement, the cost to each individual Parish and School is somewhat "nominal", especially when compared to the significant costs that would be incurred in defending just one claim. A suitable formula was adopted to share the costs. For our parish it is \$59,567.00.

All of us are saddened by the grave harm caused by the failures of those entrusted with that sacred responsibility to care for our young people. We pray for all survivors of sexual abuse, that they may know God's healing. And we hope that, moving forward, our Church may have a renewed fervor in bringing the love and truth of Christ to all.


