

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Today's Gospel reading recounts another sign, or miracle, found in John's Gospel, the raising of Lazarus. The context for the story of raising Lazarus is the Jewish leaders' growing animosity toward Jesus. Jesus has been in Jerusalem, taking part in the feast of the Dedication, which we have come to know as Hanukkah. The people have been pressing him to declare plainly whether he is the Messiah. Jesus tells them to look to his works, which testify to his coming from God.

Mary and Martha, the sisters of Lazarus, send word to Jesus that his friend is ill. Jesus is said to love Mary, Martha, and Lazarus, but he delays his journey for two days. The delay heightens the drama and shows Jesus' obedience to God, who is glorified through Lazarus's resurrection. The scene described at Bethany is a sad one. Martha meets Jesus weeping and saying if Jesus had been there, Lazarus would not have died. Then Martha's sister, Mary, comes to Jesus saying that Jesus could have cured Lazarus. Jesus asks to be brought to Lazarus's tomb where he prays and calls Lazarus out of the tomb.

Set against the backdrop of Jesus' impending death, many elements of the raising of Lazarus foreshadow the good news of Jesus' own Resurrection. In raising Lazarus, Jesus shows his power over death so that when Jesus dies, those who believe in him might remember that and take hope. Just as Jesus calls for the stone to be rolled away from Lazarus's tomb, so too will the disciples find the stone rolled away from Jesus' tomb.

The Gospel today calls us to reflect on Baptism as a dying and rising with Jesus. With Martha and Mary, we are called to profess our belief that Jesus is indeed the Resurrection and the life.

SACRAMENTS

Baptisms are held every Sunday after the 12:00 noon Mass. Baptismal Registration forms can be found in the Parish Office or on our website. Please contact the parish office for additional information or questions. Godparents must be practicing Catholics, age 16 or older, have already received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, and, if married, married in accord with Catholic Church Law.

Matrimony: Diocesan Common Policy requires nine to twelve months advance notification of the priest or deacon and attendance at marriage preparation. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) - Mondays at 7:00 p.m., September through Easter. Please contact the Parish Office for information.

Visitation of the Sick: Please notify the Parish Office when a member of the Parish is in the hospital or if someone is unable to attend Mass and wishes to receive Communion.

Persons with Celiac Disease: Persons with this challenge are usually unable to receive the normal wheat host used for Mass. We provide a separate chalice for the reception of Holy Communion at each Mass. As the Eucharistic Ministers are receiving Holy Communion at the altar, please come forward to the front of the Church and someone will bring the chalice for you to receive the Precious Blood.






By now, you should have received Bishop Gainer's Impact Report for 2022. This booklet summarizes the significance of your giving and reviews the numerous ways funds are utilized throughout our Diocese. With more than 90 ministries and programs, Bishop is grateful for all of your financial and spiritual gifts. It is these works of Christian charity and mercy that help keep our faith alive in our homes, churches, schools, and community. Together, we are true disciples of Christ, working together to spread the faith.

It is fitting that the 2023 Diocesan Annual Campaign theme is "Together in Faith, Together in the Eucharist". When we give of ourselves and give to others, we are living examples of Christ offering himself in the Holy Eucharist.
