
FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's reading from Matthew's Gospel comes after a discourse in which Jesus reproaches people who have witnessed his mighty deeds yet still lack belief. In this context, today's Gospel explains the reason for this unbelief and reveals what is necessary for faith.

Jesus first prays in thanksgiving to God who has made himself known to Jesus' disciples. He praises God who has made himself known to the "little ones" and not of the wise and learned. As in other recent readings from Matthew's Gospel, a contrast is made here between the unbelieving Pharisees, who are wise and learned, and the faithful disciples, tax collectors, and sinners with whom Jesus keeps company.

In the concluding sentences of today's Gospel, Jesus' teaching is again contrasted to the teaching of the Pharisees. This common theme of Matthew's Gospel probably reflects tension that existed between Jesus and the Pharisees and between the Pharisees and the community of Christians for whom Matthew wrote. Pharisaic Judaism became the predominant form of Judaism after the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem about 70 A.D. Here that tension is expressed as alternative paths of holiness. The careful observance of the Mosaic law taught by the Pharisees could be experienced by some as difficult and burdensome. In contrast, Jesus' way of holiness is presented as uncomplicated and even restful.





July 4th, A Time to Celebrate and Reflect

Across our country families will be gathering to observe the Fourth of July with picnics, parades and fireworks. It is one of our most popular national holidays as the birthday of our country. Looking back to 1776 we see a history of accomplishment and struggle. Accomplishment as we have grown to become the world's superpower and struggle as we contended with challenges to fully live up to our ideals at home and threats from abroad.

How did we get here? Those brave souls we recognize as the founders of our country charted the course in our documents, from the Declaration of Independence to the Constitution and its constitutive Bill of Rights. What wisdom was at work when they began to frame these guideposts of our culture? Countless scholars have dissected these documents to show the various traces of political and philosophical thought that they contain. Some have traced elements back to St. Thomas Aguinas. How so? None of the founders were Catholic and would not normally have been familiar with Catholic authors. At that time the religious divide ran deep. One article does note that Thomas Jefferson was acquainted with the works of a contemporary Protestant scholar, Algernon Sydney, who was himself conversant with the writings of St. Robert Bellarmine. Bellarmine was a 16th century Jesuit priest who was part of a broad renewal of the thought of Aguinas.

A key area traced to Aquinas is the element of natural law present in the Declaration of Independence and Bill of Rights. Natural law, as framed by Aguinas, is a law placed in our very nature that is knowable to us and speaks to morality in human actions. A good way to understand this is that virtually every human society from its inception has had laws or norms against stealing, murder, lying and such. Yes, these are contained in the 10 commandments, but run far deeper in our human experience. We just know they are wrong. The natural law, with its origin in God as Creator, is supreme to any human legislation and is the basis for saying that we have inherent rights as a human person, rights that do not come from any government, nor can one take them away. This is perhaps one of the most important principles that the founders used both to justify their revolt from English rule and to limit the powers of the government they would create.

Interestingly, Dr. Martin Luther King will invoke natural law in his quest for the recognition of civil rights for African Americans. While some want to say that our country is irredeemable, I would respectfully suggest that are we a model for others who see a free and flourishing society as a desirable goal, for the basic elements have been in our possession as our foundational documents. Keep our principles and they will keep us.




