TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's Gospel continues the story that began in last week's Gospel. Simon Peter was called the "rock" upon which Jesus would build his Church. Now that the disciples have acknowledged that Jesus is the Messiah, Jesus confides in them the outcome of his ministry: he must suffer and die in Jerusalem to be raised on the third day. Peter rejects this prediction, and Jesus rebukes him severely, calling him "Satan." In opposing this aspect of Jesus' mission, Peter shows that he is no longer speaking based on the revelation from God but as a human being. Jesus then teaches all of the disciples about the difficult path of discipleship: to be Christ's disciple is to follow in his way of the cross.

Messianic expectations were a common aspect of first-century Judaism. Under Roman occupation, many in Israel hoped and prayed that God would send a Messiah to free the Jews from Roman oppression. The common view was that the Messiah would be a political figure, a king that would free Israel from Roman rule. This is perhaps what Peter envisioned when he was led to recognize Jesus as the Messiah.

Jesus would be more like the suffering servant described by the prophet Isaiah than the political liberator. Those who would be Jesus' disciples would be called to a similar life of service. Perhaps this is what Peter feared most in Jesus' prediction of his Passion. He whom Jesus had called "rock" would also be called upon to offer himself in sacrifice and service to others. Christian leaders today are still called to sacrifice and serve others as Jesus did.

Back to School 2023

Last year we saw the Federal Government using the school lunch program to force schools to accept the Biden Administration's radical redefinition of gender or else send poor students away hungry. Where are we today?

The State of New Jersey is suing three school districts for the horror of putting into their local policy that they would notify parents if their child wishes to use a different name or gender in school. The state education office seems to think that parents cannot be trusted in such matters as they might not be as enlightened as school staff.

This is not the tradition of our country. In 1925 the US Supreme Court ruled in favor of both the right of private and religious schools to exist and the right of parents to direct the education of their children. The case was Pierce vs the Society of Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary. At the heart of the case was a law passed in Oregon (Oregon Compulsory Education Act of 1922) that required all parents to send their children to public schools. Private and Religious schools were not acceptable. The law was supported by the Masonic Lodge and the KKK in Oregon as they were opposed to the presence of Catholic immigrants and thought that the public schools would properly indoctrinate these children away from "papacy". With the support of the US Bishops the Sisters filed suit to protect their right to operate a school, and they were joined by a private military academy that was also affected by the law.

Two quotes from the Court's decision stand out: the law created "unreasonable interference with the liberty of parents and guardians to direct the upbringing of the children" and "the child is not the mere creature of the state".

Several states (among them California and Minnesota) have passed laws to enforce the same antiparent policy. It seems that some politicians have forgotten these court cases and the recognition of parental rights. In the name of the most radical gender ideology the state and its schools are dead set to allow students to make life altering decisions apart from or even against their parent's determinations. Odd, a school cannot give a student an aspirin without written parental permission, yet can promote the most profound rejection of God-given biology. The groups promoting such assaults on the family may change their names, but in their philosophy they operate under the same premise. Use the power of the government to accomplish what good people of faith or common sense would reject.






