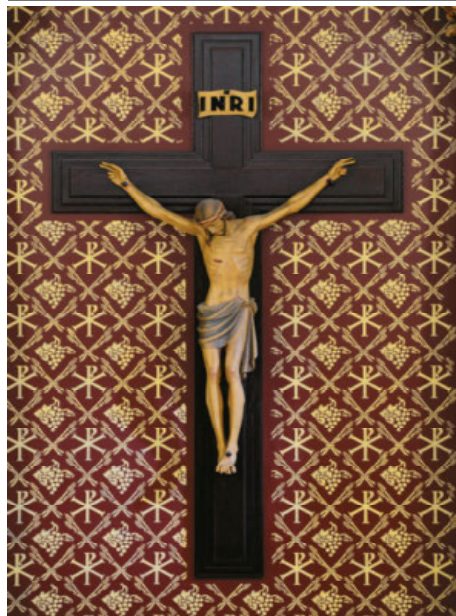

THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today we begin a continuous reading of Mark's Gospel that will carry us through this segment of the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. As we learn at the beginning of today's Gospel reading, Jesus preaches the Kingdom of God in continuity with the preaching of John the Baptist. Like John the Baptist, Jesus' pronouncement of the kingdom is a call to repentance. Yet Jesus' preaching is greater than John's. Jesus begins the time of fulfillment; the Kingdom of God is already here.

In contrast to last week's Gospel, in Mark's Gospel Jesus takes the initiative in calling his first disciples. As mentioned last week, it was more typical of first-century rabbinical schools for students to seek out rabbis, asking to be their disciples. In Mark's Gospel, Jesus breaks with this tradition and invites his disciples to learn from him. Jesus is said to have first called four fisherman-Simon, Andrew, James and John. Simon and Andrew are brothers. Jesus promises that he will make them "fishers of men." James and John are also brothers. Mark does not report Jesus' words of invitation to them, but he does report that they left their fishing immediately.

The Kingdom of God is here and now. The time of fulfillment is at hand. How might our lives be different if we more fully shared this sense of immediacy of God's kingdom?

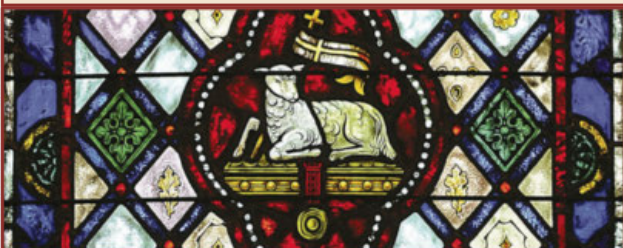
Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) - Mondays at 7:00 p.m., September through Easter. Please contact the Parish Office for information.

We provide a separate chalice for the reception of Holy Communion at each Mass. As the Eucharistic Ministers are receiving Holy Communion at the altar, please come forward to the front of the Church and someone will bring the chalice for you to receive the Precious Blood.

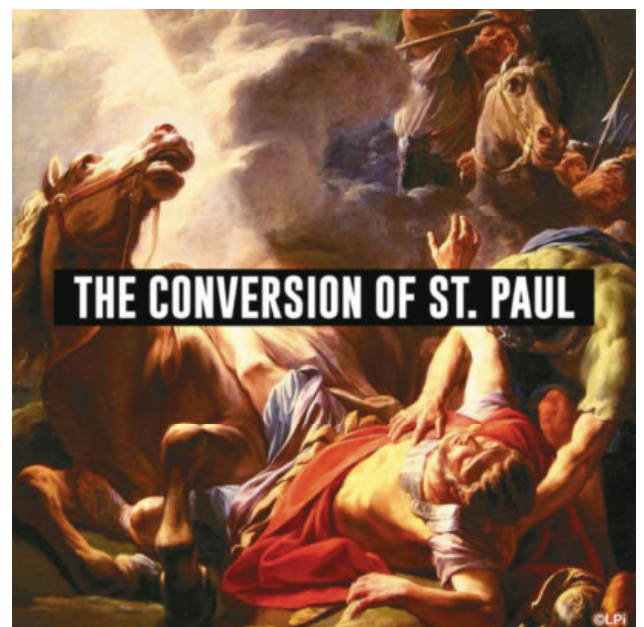

On Epiphany water, chalk, and home blessings...

There are many rich and beautiful rites and customs surrounding the feast of the Epiphany. Among them is the blessing of "Epiphany water", chalk, and home blessings. This year, Fr. Tritle performed the very lengthy rite of blessing of Epiphany water on the eve of this great solemnity. The water can be used by all the faithful, and is available in the Holy Water font, per usual. Here is a very brief excerpt from this beautiful blessing:

"In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ and by His power, we cast you out, every unclean spirit, every devilish power, every assault of the infernal adversary, every legion, every diabolical group and sect; begone and stay far from the Church of God, from all who are made in the image of God and redeemed by the precious blood of the divine Lamb. Never again dare, you cunning serpent, to deceive the human race, to persecute the Church of God, nor to strike the chosen of God and to sift them as wheat. For it is the Most High God who commands you, He to whom you heretofore in your great pride considered yourself equal; He who desires that all men might be saved and come to the knowledge of truth. God the Father commands you. God the Son commands you. God the Holy Spirit commands you. The majesty of Christ, the eternal Word of God made flesh commands you..."

In addition, blessed chalk for marking the lintels of your doors with "20+C+M+B+24"*** can be found in the back of the church with the bulletins.

***C, M, B stands for the names of the three wisemen, and "Christus mansionem Benedicat", meaning "may Christ bless this home".


