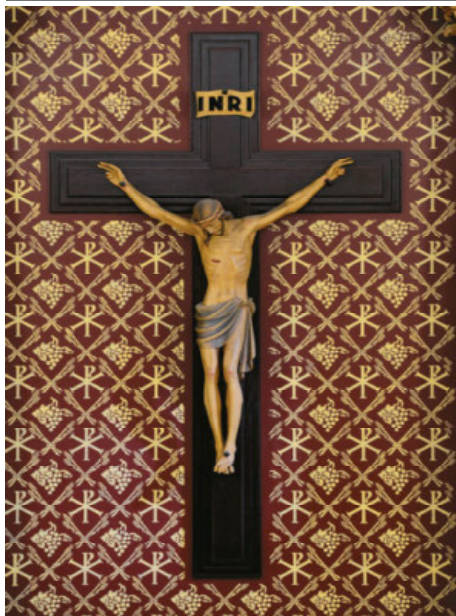

"God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Philippians 2: 9 - 11)

SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In today's Gospel, we continue to hear Mark report the miraculous healings that Jesus performed in Galilee. The Gospel begins with Jesus healing a man with leprosy. The man with leprosy took the initiative, approaching Jesus and asking for healing. In doing so, the leper violated the religious customs of the day by approaching a person who was clean. His request to Jesus can be interpreted as a courageous and daring act. The confidence of the leper in Jesus' ability to heal him is evident in the words of his request.

Although Jesus touched the leper, he did not break completely with the Law of Moses. He instructed the man not to tell anyone about the cure and told him to present himself to the priests as prescribed by the Law of Moses.

Mark's Gospel tells us that after this healing, it became difficult for Jesus' breach of social and religious norms. In touching the man with leprosy, Jesus made himself unclean. Mark's narrative, however, leads to the conclusion that Jesus' movement was hampered by his popularity. Despite his instructions, the cured man spread the word about Jesus' healing power. Even when Jesus was in deserted places, people sought him out in search of his healing.

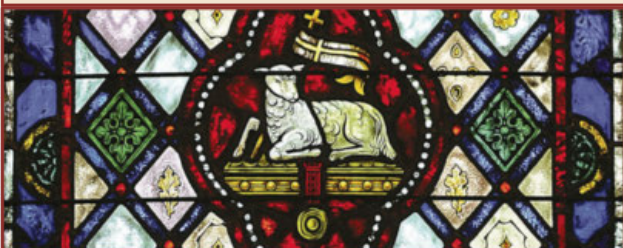

**SACRAMENTS**

Baptisms are held every Sunday after the 12:00 noon Mass. Baptismal Registration forms can be found in the Parish Office or on our website. Please contact the parish office for additional information or questions. Godparents must be practicing Catholics, age 16 or older, have already received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, and, if married, married in accord with Catholic Church Law.

Matrimony: Diocesan Common Policy requires nine to twelve months advance notification of the priest or deacon and attendance at marriage preparation. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) - Mondays at 7:00 p.m., September through Easter. Please contact the Parish Office for information.

Visitation of the Sick: Please notify the Parish Office when a member of the Parish is in the hospital or if someone is unable to attend Mass and wishes to receive Communion.

Persons with Celiac Disease: Persons with this challenge are usually unable to receive the normal wheat host used for Mass. We provide a separate chalice for the reception of Holy Communion at each Mass. As the Eucharistic Ministers are receiving Holy Communion at the altar, please come forward to the front of the Church and someone will bring the chalice for you to receive the Precious Blood.

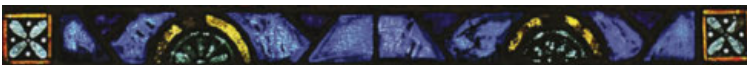

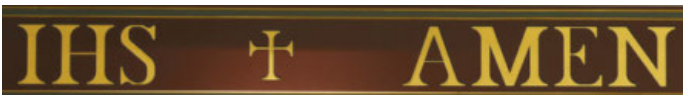

Starting in October of 2019 we opened our Capital Campaign in order to fund four projects that were needed for our parish. The campaign formally concluded this past December. As of this date we have completed three of the four projects: the construction of the new residence, renovation of the old rectory for additional office and meeting space, and the renovation of the Social Hall. These are now in regular use and have been fully paid for. The final project is to renovate the lower level of the Church to provide for additional space that can be used especially during school time for other parish events, such as funeral lunches. Our Building Fund account has sufficient funds to cover the anticipated cost of this fourth project. We are in the final design stage and look forward to the project work starting this summer.

When we began these projects there was a desire to do so in a low key manner, one that would not ask for any specific commitments or pledges, but trust in the generosity of our parishioners. You have never let us down. I have been very grateful for the clear commitment that our parishioners have made to Holy Name of Jesus Parish. May our Lord bless you and your families for the goodness you show to His Church.

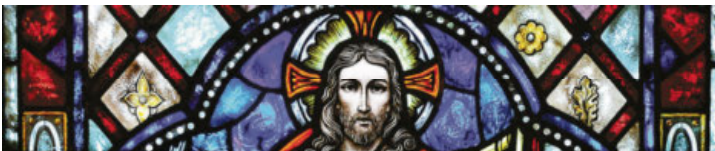
