"God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Philippians 2: 9 - 11)

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

On the second Sunday of Lent in each Lectionary cycle, the Gospel reading proclaims the story of Jesus' Transfiguration. This event is reported in each of the Synoptic Gospels - Matthew, Mark, and Luke. This year, we hear Mark's report of this event.

Jesus takes three of his disciples-Peter, James, and John- to a high mountain. While they are there, Elijah and Moses appear with Jesus. Elijah and Moses are significant figures in the history of Israel. The appearance of these two important figures from Israel's history with Jesus signifies Jesus' continuity with the Law, and with the prophets and that Jesus is the fulfillment of all that was promised to the people of Israel.

In his Transfiguration, we see an anticipation of the glory of Jesus' Resurrection. In each of the reports of the Transfiguration, Jesus instructs the disciples to keep secret what they have seen until after the Son of Man has risen from the dead. The disciples cannot possibly understand Jesus' Transfiguration until they also witness his passion and death. We hear the story of Jesus' Transfiguration early in Lent, but we have the benefit of hindsight. In our hearing of it, we anticipate Jesus' Resurrection, even as we prepare to remember Jesus' passion and death.

Godparents must be practicing Catholics, age 16 or older, have already received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, and, if married, married in accord with Catholic Church Law.

Matrimony: Diocesan Common Policy requires nine to twelve months advance notification of the priest or deacon and attendance at marriage preparation. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) - Mondays at 7:00 p.m., September through Easter. Please contact the Parish Office for information.

Visitation of the Sick: Please notify the Parish Office when a member of the Parish is in the hospital or if someone is unable to attend Mass and wishes to receive Communion.

Persons with Celiac Disease: Persons with this challenge are usually unable to receive the normal wheat host used for Mass. We provide a separate chalice for the reception of Holy Communion at each Mass. As the Eucharistic Ministers are receiving Holy Communion at the altar, please come forward to the front of the Church and someone will bring the chalice for you to receive the Precious Blood.

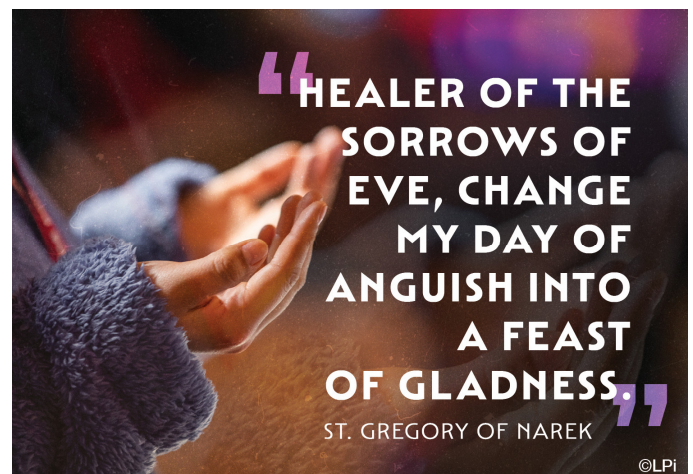

Starting in October of 2019 we opened our Capital Campaign in order to fund four projects that were needed for our parish. The campaign formally concluded this past December. As of this date we have completed three of the four projects: the construction of the new residence, renovation of the old rectory for additional office and meeting space, and the renovation of the Social Hall. These are now in regular use and have been fully paid for. The final project is to renovate the lower level of the Church to provide for additional space that can be used especially during school time for other parish events, such as funeral lunches. Our Building Fund account has sufficient funds to cover the anticipated cost of this fourth project. We are in the final design stage and look forward to the project work starting this summer.

When we began these projects there was a desire to do so in a low key manner, one that would not ask for any specific commitments or pledges, but trust in the generosity of our parishioners. You have never let us down. I have been very grateful for the clear commitment that our parishioners have made to Holy Name of Jesus Parish. May our Lord bless you and your families for the goodness you show to His Church.

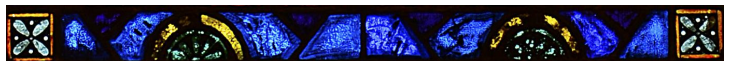
