"God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Philippians 2: 9 - 11)

#### THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

In today's Gospel we read about how Jesus overturned the tables of the merchants and the moneychangers in the Temple at Jerusalem. Worship at the Temple in Jerusalem included animal sacrifice, and merchants sold animals to worshipers. Moneychangers exchanged Roman coins, which bore the image of the Roman emperor, for the temple coins that were needed to pay the temple tax.

Jesus' action at the Temple in Jerusalem is recorded in all four Gospels and is often understood to be among the events that led to Jesus' arrest and Crucifixion.

After clearing the Temple of the merchants and the moneychangers, John's Gospel tells us that the people asked for a sign of Jesus' authority to do such an audacious act. In response, Jesus predicted his death and Resurrection.

During Lent we reflect upon the meaning of this sign for us and for our world. We might take this opportunity to consider the quality of our prayer and worship. In our prayers we seek to deepen our relationship with the person of Christ. Christ promises to be present with us when we gather for prayer.

Starting in October of 2019 we opened our Capital Campaign in order to fund four projects that were needed for our parish. The campaign formally concluded this past December. As of this date we have completed three of the four projects: the construction of the new residence, renovation of the old rectory for additional office and meeting space, and the renovation of the Social Hall. These are now in regular use and have been fully paid for. The final project is to renovate the lower level of the Church to provide for additional space that can be used especially during school time for other parish events, such as funeral lunches. Our Building Fund account has sufficient funds to cover the anticipated cost of this fourth project. We are in the final design stage and look forward to the project work starting this summer.

When we began these projects there was a desire to do so in a low key manner, one that would not ask for any specific commitments or pledges, but trust in the generosity of our parishioners. You have never let us down. I have been very grateful for the clear commitment that our parishioners have made to Holy Name of Jesus Parish. May our Lord bless you and your families for the goodness you show to His Church.






