FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

The fourth Sunday of Lent is sometimes called *Laetare* Sunday. *Laetare* is a Latin word that means "rejoice"." Traditionally, Sundays are named after the first word of the liturgy's opening antiphon. On this Sunday, the antiphon is taken from the book of the prophet Isaiah. Even as we observe our Lenten sacrifices, we rejoice in anticipation of the joy that will be ours at Easter.

Today's Gospel reading is taken from John's Gospel. It consists of two parts. The first part is the final sentence of Jesus' reply to Nicodemus, the Pharisee who approached Jesus at night. Nicodemus acknowledged Jesus as someone who had come from God and seemed to want to be a follower of Jesus. Jesus greeted Nicodemus with the observation that one must be born from above to see the Kingdom of God.

The second part of the conversation with Nicodemus in today's Gospel is a theological reflection on Jesus' words to Nicodemus. The Gospel of John is known for this kind of reflection offered within the narrative. In these reflections, John elaborates on a number of themes that are found in his Gospel: light and darkness, belief and unbelief, good and evil, salvation and condemnation.

In John's reflection, we find an observation about human sinfulness. Jesus is the light that has come into the world, but people preferred the darkness. We wish to keep our sins hidden, even from God. Jesus has come into the world to reveal our sins so that they may be forgiven. This is the Good News; it is the reason for our rejoicing in this season of Lent and throughout our lives.


Faithful Stewards...Building Our Future

Starting in October of 2019 we opened our Capital Campaign in order to fund four projects that were needed for our parish. The campaign formally concluded this past December. As of this date we have completed three of the four projects: the construction of the new residence, renovation of the old rectory for additional office and meeting space, and the renovation of the Social Hall. These are now in regular use and have been fully paid for. The final project is to renovate the lower level of the Church to provide for additional space that can be used especially during school time for other parish events, such as funeral lunches. Our Building Fund account has sufficient funds to cover the anticipated cost of this fourth project. We are in the final design stage and look forward to the project work starting this summer.

When we began these projects there was a desire to do so in a low key manner, one that would not ask for any specific commitments or pledges, but trust in the generosity of our parishioners. You have never let us down. I have been very grateful for the clear commitment that our parishioners have made to Holy Name of Jesus Parish. May our Lord bless you and your families for the goodness you show to His Church.




