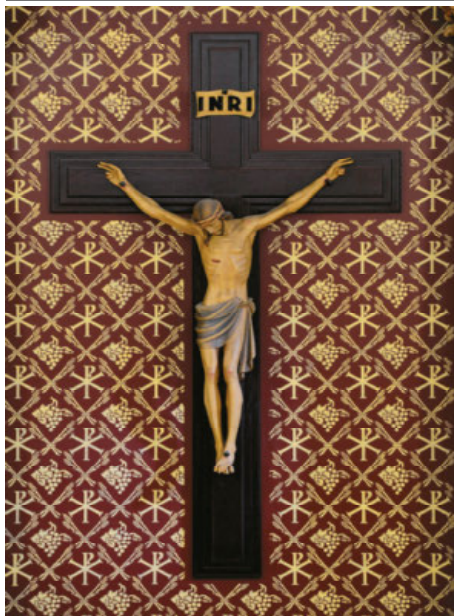

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Today's Gospel reading is taken from the Gospel of John. Chapter 12 of John's Gospel is a preparation for the beginning of the passion narrative to follow. Jesus has just raised Lazarus from the dead-an important sign in John's Gospel, which inspired many people to believe in Jesus. This event also marks the turning point in Jesus' conflict with the Jewish authorities. John's Gospel tells us that the Sanhedrin met after this event and made plans to kill Jesus.

Following his triumphant entry into Jerusalem, Jesus predicted his suffering, death, and Resurrection and prepared his disciples to believe in the salvation that his death would be beneficial. He also taught that those who would be his disciples must follow his example of sacrifice. This theme will be repeated in John's account of the Last Supper, when Jesus washed the feet of his disciples as an example of how they must serve one another.

The final section of today's Gospel might be read as John's parallel to the agony in the garden. Although comparable words are found in today's reading, Jesus gives a confident response to the question he raises when asking God to save him from his impending death. After announcing his conviction that it is for this purpose that he came, a voice from heaven speaks, as if in answer to Jesus' prayer. In John's Gospel, Jesus teaches that this voice was sent for the sake of those who would believe in him.

Through his death and Resurrection, Jesus conquered Satan, the ruler of this world. In this way the world is judged, but the judgment is not condemnation. Instead, through Jesus' dying and rising, salvation is brought to the world.

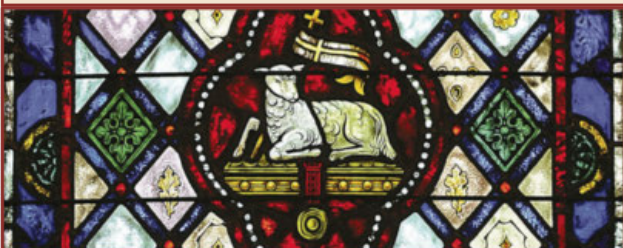

**SACRAMENTS**

Baptisms are held every Sunday after the 12:00 noon Mass. Baptismal Registration forms can be found in the Parish Office or on our website. Please contact the parish office for additional information or questions. Godparents must be practicing Catholics, age 16 or older, have already received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, and, if married, married in accord with Catholic Church Law.

Matrimony: Diocesan Common Policy requires nine to twelve months advance notification of the priest or deacon and attendance at marriage preparation. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) - Mondays at 7:00 p.m., September through Easter. Please contact the Parish Office for information.

Visitation of the Sick: Please notify the Parish Office when a member of the Parish is in the hospital or if someone is unable to attend Mass and wishes to receive Communion.

Persons with Celiac Disease: Persons with this challenge are usually unable to receive the normal wheat host used for Mass. We provide a separate chalice for the reception of Holy Communion at each Mass. As the Eucharistic Ministers are receiving Holy Communion at the altar, please come forward to the front of the Church and someone will bring the chalice for you to receive the Precious Blood.

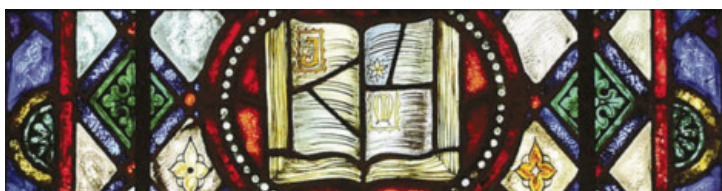
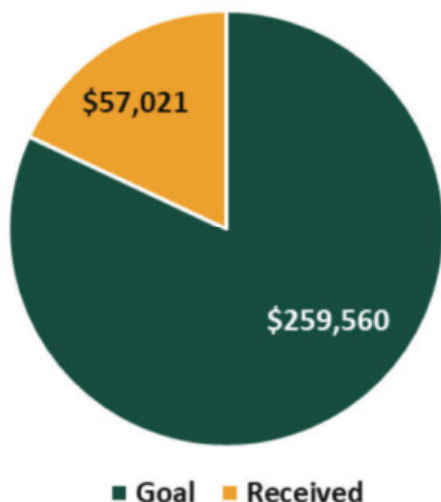

Faithful Stewards...Building Our Future

Starting in October of 2019 we opened our Capital Campaign in order to fund four projects that were needed for our parish. The campaign formally concluded this past December. As of this date we have completed three of the four projects: the construction of the new residence, renovation of the old rectory for additional office and meeting space, and the renovation of the Social Hall. These are now in regular use and have been fully paid for. The final project is to renovate the lower level of the Church to provide for additional space that can be used especially during school time for other parish events, such as funeral lunches. Our Building Fund account has sufficient funds to cover the anticipated cost of this fourth project. We are in the final design stage and look forward to the project work starting this summer.

When we began these projects there was a desire to do so in a low key manner, one that would not ask for any specific commitments or pledges, but trust in the generosity of our parishioners. You have never let us down. I have been very grateful for the clear commitment that our parishioners have made to Holy Name of Jesus Parish. May our Lord bless you and your families for the goodness you show to His Church.

**2024 Diocesan Annual Campaign****A Culture War or ...**

One of the things we hear in the news is that we are engaged in a culture war as social forces debate many issues. A recent article I saw questioned that premise. An Irish writer, Mark Dooley, said rather than identifying these disputes as two factions proposing different views of culture, call it what it is, a spiritual battle. As I thought about many of the key areas that seem to divide people these days some clearly stand out as a contrast of good and evil, in other words, a spiritual battle. This battle is being waged across much of our western Judeo-Christian world.

As we read the scripture in Lent we see our Lord place a focus on our relationship with God and what deters us from living out that relationship. Many of the readings from the Old Testament taken from the prophets are just that; how sin destroys the beauty of the Lord's love for us, leaving us mired in a life that seems to get farther and farther away from God, all the while thinking things are fine.

While it is a work that adds elements to the Gospel narrative of the Passion, the film *Passion of the Christ* has a fascinating inclusion of the presence of Satan. As Jesus makes his way to Calvary, glimpses of a shadowy figure, who we clearly identify as Satan, haunts the background of the scenes. Our Lord knows who stands in direct opposition to His Father and who seeks to draw us apart from the very source of goodness. The lure of evil is so often subtle and cloaked in a false language of love when it is in reality the very opposite. Satan does not drive the nails that pierce the hands and feet of Jesus, he lets us do that for him.

To grow in faith, a key goal of Lent, lets us see the contrast of darkness and light, and moves us to embrace the light that is Christ, a light that shines even in the darkness and calls us home.

PRO-LIFE CORNER

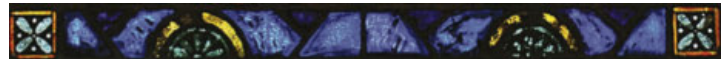
