PALM SUNDAY OF THE LORD'S PASSION

This Sunday, called Palm or Passion Sunday, is the first day of Holy Week. Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday are called the *Triduum* - three days that are the highlight of the Church year. There are two Gospels proclaimed at today's Mass. The first Gospel, proclaimed before the procession with palms, tells of Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem. Riding on a borrowed colt, Jesus was hailed by the crowds as they blessed God and shouted "Hosanna!" This event is reported in each of the four Gospels.

Throughout the Gospel, Mark challenges the reader to consider the claim with which the Gospel begins: Jesus is the Son of God. In Mark's telling of the passion narrative, Jesus understood his death to have been preordained, and he accepted this death in obedience to God's will. At his arrest, Jesus acknowledged that the preordained time had arrived. Jesus was both confident and silent before his accusers. After he was sentenced to death, Jesus did not speak again until his final cry from the cross. The bystanders misunderstood and believed that he was calling for Elijah. The Roman centurion, however, affirmed what Mark has presented throughout this Gospel: Jesus is the Son of God. Nowhere was this revealed more fully than in his death on the cross.

During Holy Week, we prayerfully remember the events of Jesus' passion and death. As we meditate on the cross, we ask again and anew what it means to make the statement of faith that Jesus, in his obedient suffering and dying, revealed himself to us as God's Son.



A Culture War or ...

One of the things we hear in the news is that we are engaged in a culture war as social forces debate many issues. A recent article I saw questioned that premise. An Irish writer, Mark Dooley, said rather than identifying these disputes as two factions proposing different views of culture, call it what it is, a spiritual battle. As I thought about many of the key areas that seem to divide people these days some clearly stand out as a contrast of good and evil, in other words, a spiritual battle. This battle is being waged across much of our western Judeo-Christian world.

As we read the scripture in Lent we see our Lord place a focus on our relationship with God and what deters us from living out that relationship. Many of the readings from the Old Testament taken from the prophets are just that; how sin destroys the beauty of the Lord's love for us, leaving us mired in a life that seems to get farther and farther away from God, all the while thinking things are fine.

While it is a work that adds elements to the Gospel narrative of the Passion, the film Passion of the Christ has a fascinating inclusion of the presence of Satan. As Jesus makes his way to Calvary, glimpses of a shadowy figure, who we clearly identify as Satan, haunts the background of the scenes. Our Lord knows who stands in direct opposition to His Father and who seeks to draw us apart from the very source of goodness. The lure of evil is so often subtle and cloaked in a false language of love when it is in reality the very opposite. Satan does not drive the nails that pierce the hands and feet of Jesus, he lets us do that for him.

To grow in faith, a key goal of Lent, lets us see the contrast of darkness and light, and moves us to embrace the light that is Christ, a light that shines even in the darkness and calls us home.




