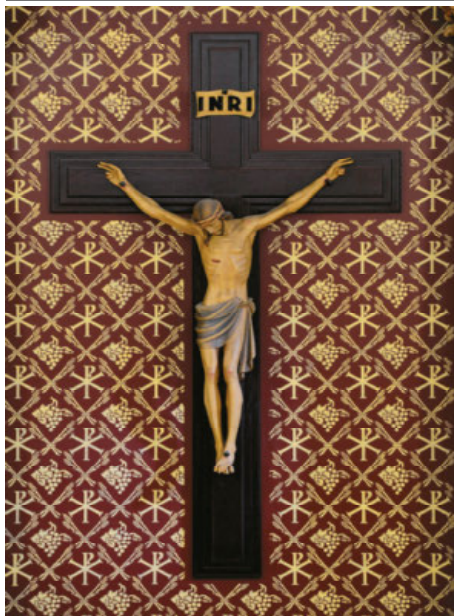

FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

The fourth Sunday of Easter is also called Good Shepherd Sunday. In each of the three lectionary cycles, our Gospel is taken from the 10th chapter of the Gospel of John. In Cycle B, we hear the middle verse of this chapter. Unless we consider this chapter in the greater context of John's Gospel, we will miss the radical nature of the statement Jesus makes when he declares himself to be the Good Shepherd.

The concern of a good shepherd for his sheep is part of the shepherd's job. Jesus says, however, that the actions of the good shepherd are based upon the relationship that develops between the shepherd and the sheep. This is at the heart of the difference between the good shepherd and the hired shepherd. The good shepherd knows the sheep and therefore acts out of love. For the Good Shepherd, this is never simply part of a job; this love-in-action is integral to his identity.

As with so much of John's Gospel, one hears in this passage John's particular focus on Christology. As the sheep are known by the Good Shepherd, the Father knows Jesus and Jesus knows the Father. There is an essential unity between the Father and the Son. The freedom with which Jesus acts when he lays down his life is rooted in the unity he shares with his Father.

In this context, Jesus also refers to others whom he shares a relationship. By this reference, John probably understands the eventual inclusion of the Gentiles in the Christian community. Our modern ears hear this as a reference to Christian unity. The work of ecumenism is to restore unity among all Christians so that we form one flock under one shepherd, as God desires.

**SACRAMENTS**

Baptisms are held every Sunday after the 12:00 noon Mass. Baptismal Registration forms can be found in the Parish Office or on our website. Please contact the parish office for additional information or questions. Godparents must be practicing Catholics, age 16 or older, have already received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, and, if married, married in accord with Catholic Church Law.

Matrimony: Diocesan Common Policy requires nine to twelve months advance notification of the priest or deacon and attendance at marriage preparation. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) - Mondays at 7:00 p.m., September through Easter. Please contact the Parish Office for information.

Visitation of the Sick: Please notify the Parish Office when a member of the Parish is in the hospital or if someone is unable to attend Mass and wishes to receive Communion.

Persons with Celiac Disease: Persons with this challenge are usually unable to receive the normal wheat host used for Mass. We provide a separate chalice for the reception of Holy Communion at each Mass. As the Eucharistic Ministers are receiving Holy Communion at the altar, please come forward to the front of the Church and someone will bring the chalice for you to receive the Precious Blood.

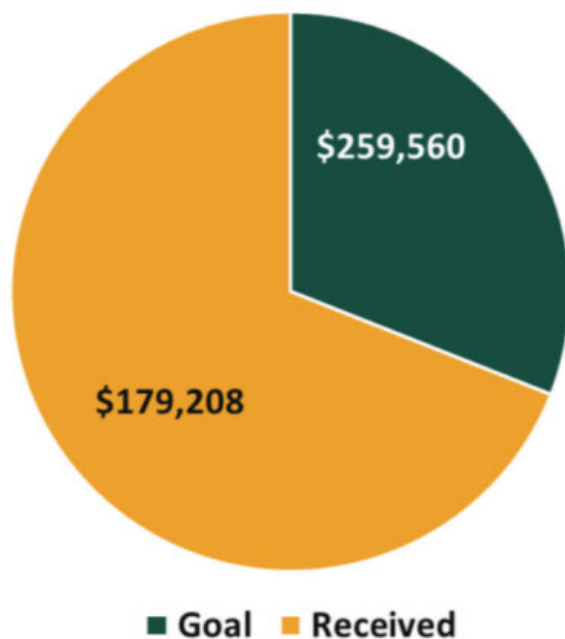

Dignitas Infinita

Infinite Dignity is the title of the most recent document from the Vatican Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith. As Christians we recognize that every human person is created in the image and likeness of God. This document outlines the way in which this permits us to recognize every person as possessed of human rights and has an inherent dignity by the very fact of their existence.

The document looks at some of the affronts to basic human dignity, such as poverty, migrants, human trafficking and similar issues. What catches the attention of the media are several particular areas namely abortion, surrogacy, gender theory and sex change. Needless to say, some are very unhappy with the document's formulations. In each case the teaching of the Church is addressed and states that how these matters are viewed today in popular culture are inconsistent with our created human dignity. Anyone familiar with the constant teaching of the Church and especially Pope St. John Paul II knows how these moral questions are often distorted and in direct conflict with the teaching of the Lord.

A recent article by Bishop Barron, well worth a read in its entirety, looks at the document and makes a fascinating observation. He notes that the document refers to the "ontological" dignity of the individual, indicating that human dignity is intrinsic and tied to the very being of the one who possess it. What is interesting is that for us this is basic, yet not everyone holds to this principle. Why do we in the west take this view for granted? Bishop Barron responds: "I stand with the British historian Tom Holland in declaring that this conviction is not a general default position but rather something bequeathed to us by the Biblical and Christian tradition."

As I have pointed out in previous reflections, what we believe matters and it matters not just personally but to everyone around us. Judeo-Christian thought has shaped western culture, provides us with our better elements and we abandon it at our peril. What protects us from the human wolves among us is not their good will but a whole way of thinking that some today would readily jettison in favor of a far more sinister philosophy, one that not only reduces God, but eventually human worth. Our dignity is not conferred by our human companions, rather it comes from God who made us.
