

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Today's reading from the Gospel of John is part of Jesus' discourse at the Last Supper. In these chapters of John's Gospel, Jesus instructs his disciples about the importance of following his example of love and service, about the gift they will receive when Jesus sends them the Holy Spirit, and about their relationship with Jesus and the world. The Last Supper discourse concludes with Jesus' prayer for his disciples.

Today's Gospel reading is taken from the middle of the Last Supper discourse. Jesus speaks about his relationship to his disciples. In his metaphor of the vine and the branches, Jesus is referencing the Hebrew Scriptures, Israel is the vineyard, and Yahweh himself tends the vineyard. In this passage, Jesus teaches his disciples that his relationship with them will not end after his death; he will remain with them always.

Jesus also teaches his disciples about the importance of the words he has taught to them. Just as Jesus will remain in the disciples, so too will his words. We come to know Jesus through the Scriptures, the living word of God. Our commitment to be Christ's disciples is sustained through God's Word. Through the Eucharist, Jesus dwells in us, remains with us, and transforms us so that we might bear fruit in his name.

We observe many people who act in ways that show their commitment to serve their neighbor. Christians and non-Christians feed the hungry, care for the sick, shelter the homeless, and give alms to the poor. These actions become acts of Christian discipleship when they are motivated by our relationship with Jesus. Whatever the immediate results, Jesus promises us that these actions will bear fruit when we undertake them in his name.





Kristallnacht

Or the *Night of Broken Glass* as we know it in English. On November 9 & 10, 1938 members of the SA and SS (Nazi paramilitary groups) went on a rampage across Germany and Austria as they smashed windows, burned and looted shops, Synagogues and homes of Jewish citizens. Estimates are that 267 Synagogues and 7,000 businesses were destroyed, and some 30,000 Jewish men arrested. While this was happening the police just looked on, fearful to intervene.

As I write this, the news reports and footage showed large numbers of demonstrators have descended on many major universities in our country. Jewish students at these institutions express grave concerns for their safety as they have been chased by these mobs screaming that they are not welcome and calling for the destruction of Israel. That is what made me think of the KristalInacht.

How did we get to this point in our country where blatant anti-Semitism is celebrated, and in some cases as university authorities seem to turn a blind eye? Commentators point to the rabid indoctrination of our young people with a deeply ingrained Marxist ideology. An ideology that seems to be present in US higher education. Their equation is simple, Israelis are the occupiers of the land and the Palestinians are the oppressed. It justifies anything the oppressed do to gain their freedom, including the atrocities committed against women and children on October 7, 2024. Some demonstrators gleefully chanted "we are Hamas", the brutal terrorist organization that began this recent outburst of violence in Israel.

This just did not originate in a vacuum, ideology is intentional. As we forget our Judeo-Christian roots and see them replaced with an ideology crafted by an angry man who hated God we should expect this. Karl Marx may be the savior for some academics, but his salvation has nothing to do with the good of humanity. Jesus, the eternal Son of God, brings hope and healing to a broken world, one broken by sin. Those who fail to remember history will be condemned to repeat it, including the history of ideas, and faith matters as the most important idea.
